



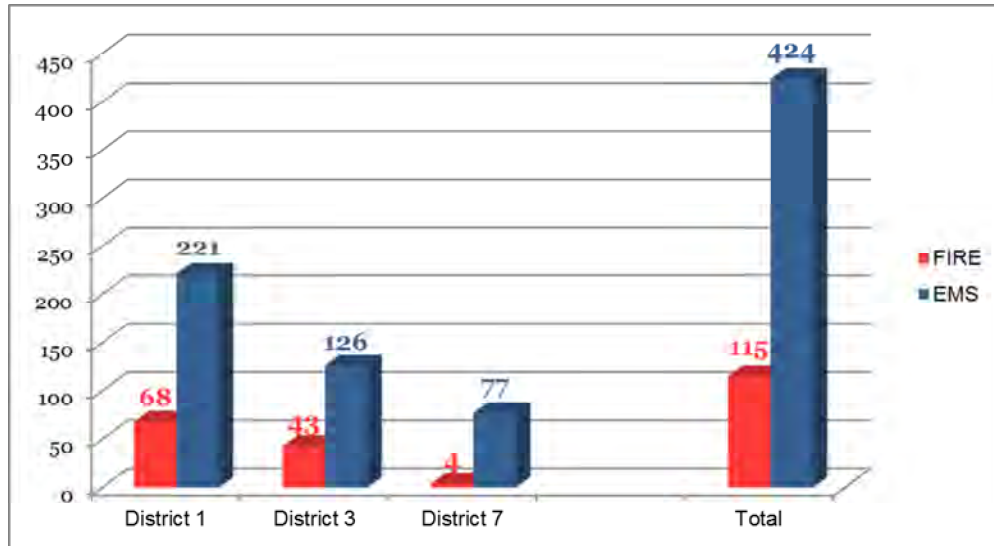

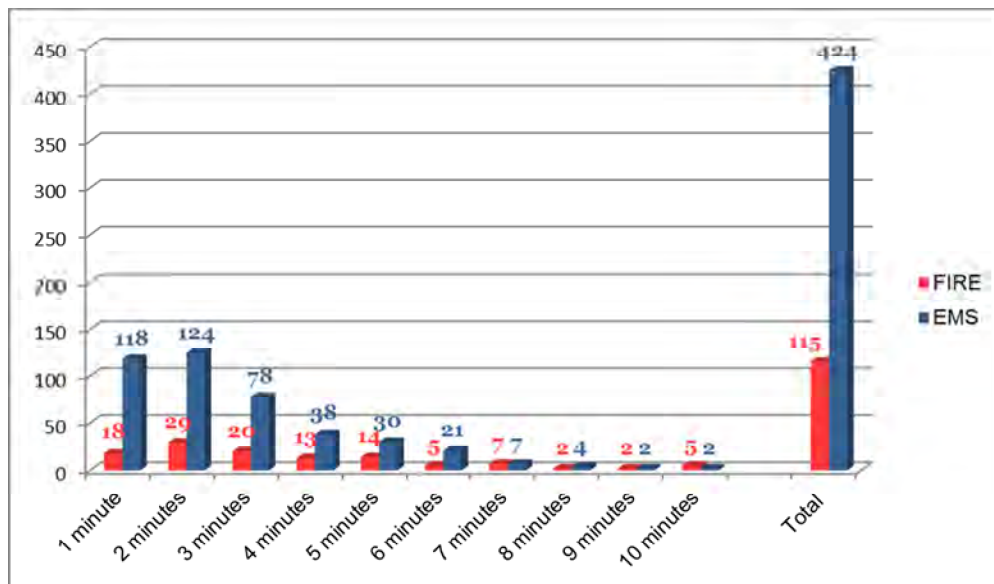


District Statistics



There were 539 responses in July. 54% of all responses were in District 1. Responses in District 3 and District 7 were 31% and 15% respectively.

Response Time

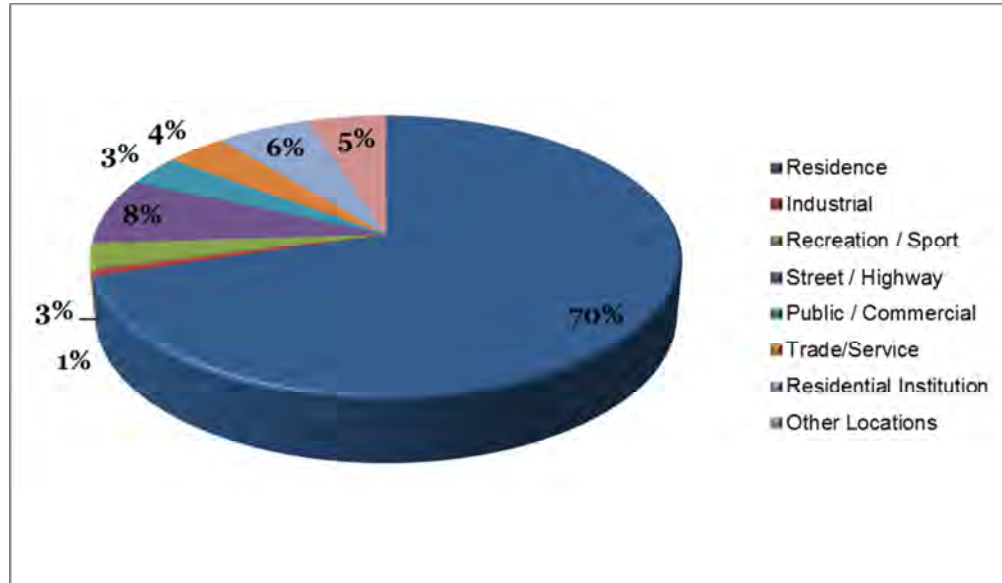


The average response time for fire emergencies was 4 minutes and 36 seconds. The average response time for EMS emergencies was 3 minutes and 12 seconds.

The Sandusky Fire Department responded to 72% of fire emergencies within four minutes and 85% of EMS emergencies within four minutes. This calculates to 82% of all emergency calls within four minutes.

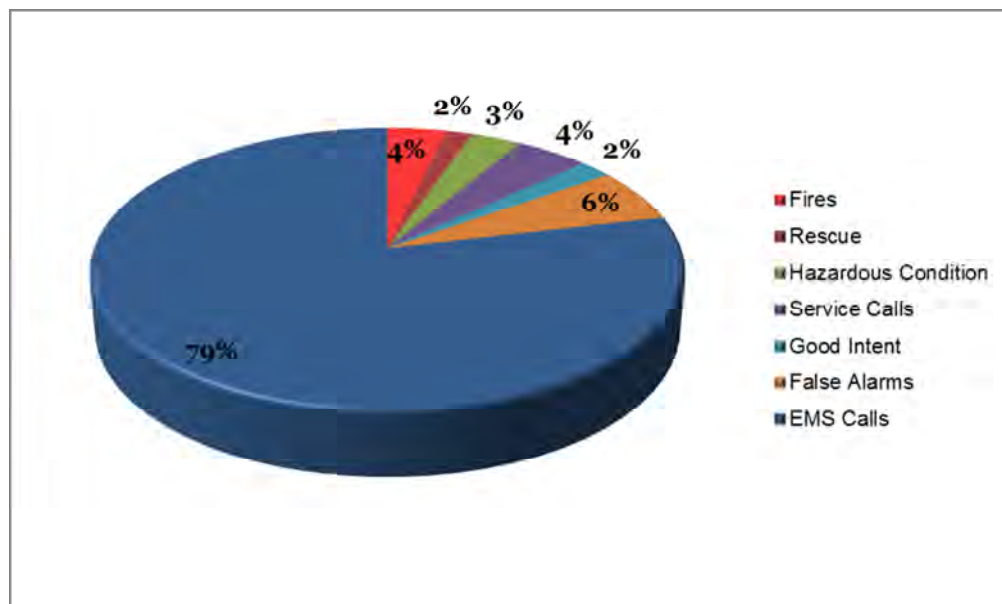


Response by Location



In July, 76% of all emergency responses were to residential occupancies (residences, nursing homes and residential institutions). Commercial buildings, recreational occupancies and streets and highways totaled 14%.

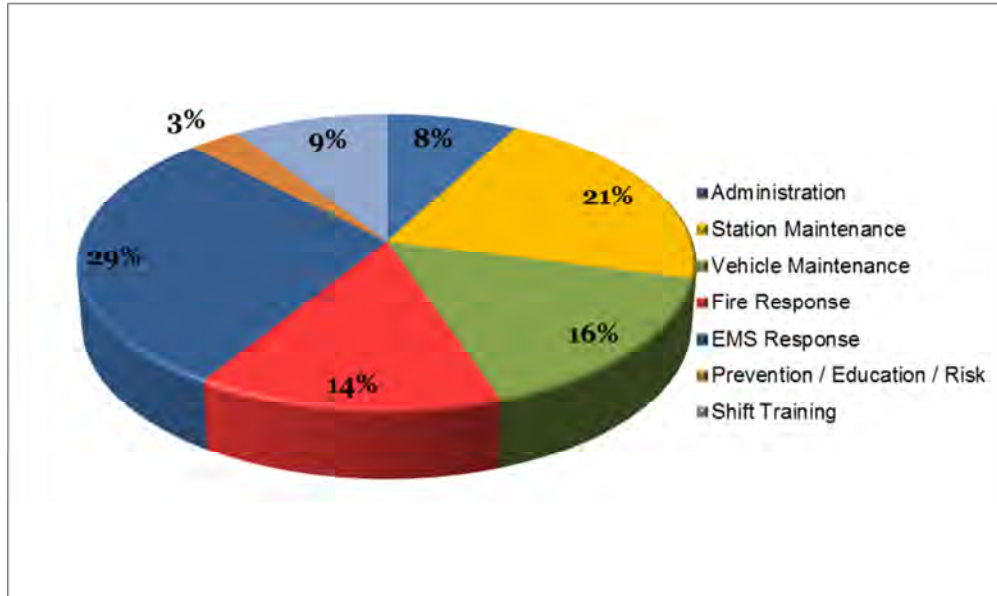
Incident Type



Ambulance service continues to be the highest requested service at 79%. Structure fire activity was 4% of all emergent activity. False alarms represented 6% of all July emergent activity. There was \$91,236 in fire loss.

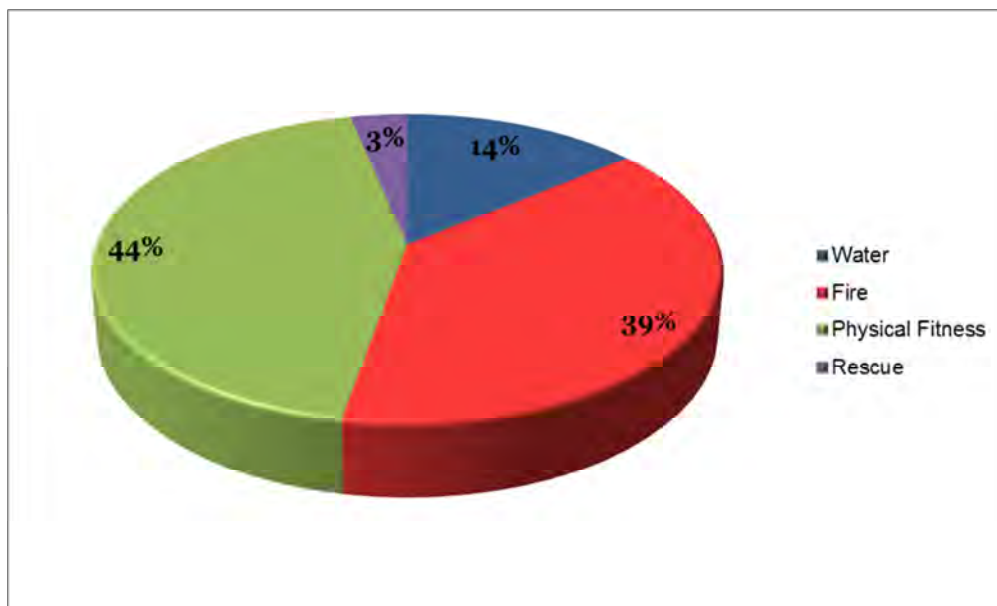


Activity



43% of all July activity was emergency response. Station and vehicle maintenance was 37% and training was 9%.

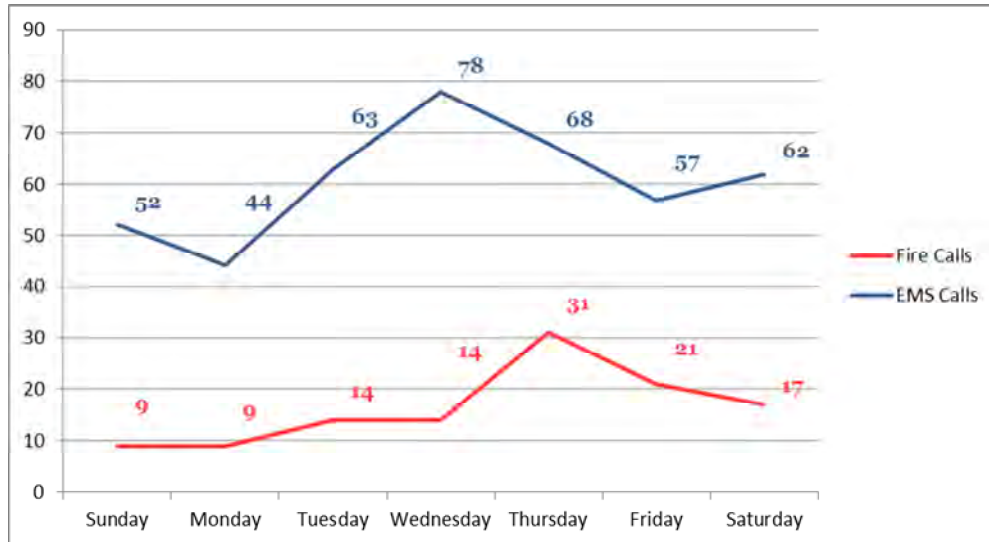
Training Analysis



44% of July training was physical fitness training. 39% was fire training with the focus on rapid intervention teams. 14% of training focused on water/boat and the remaining 3% focused on rescue.

Staffing

- The average daily staffing for July was 11 personnel per day.
- Fire Station No. 7 was closed 10 days in the month of July.

Mutual –Aid

- Sandusky Fire Department received mutual-aid three times and provided mutual-aid six times in the month of July.
