



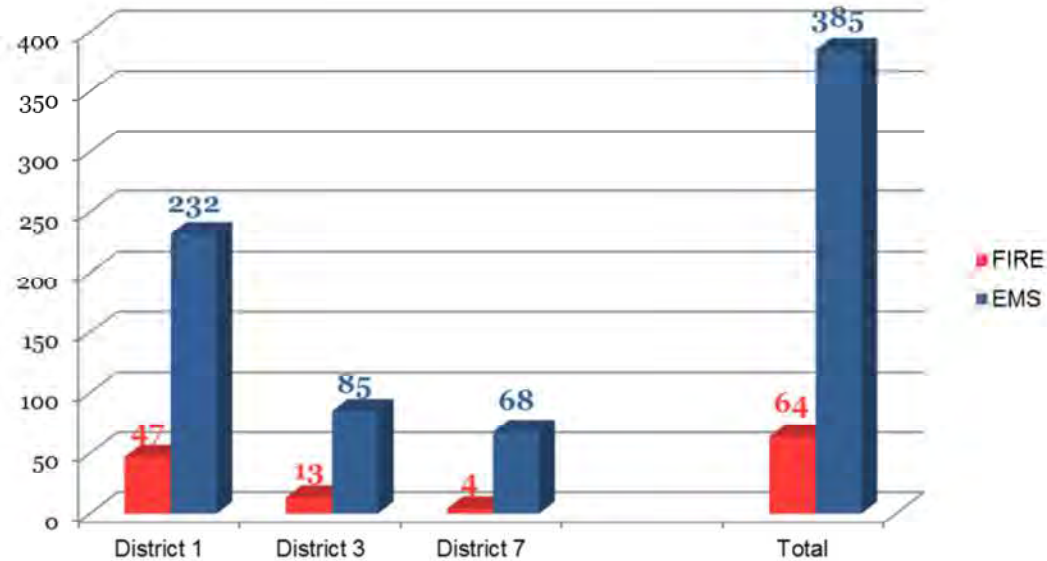

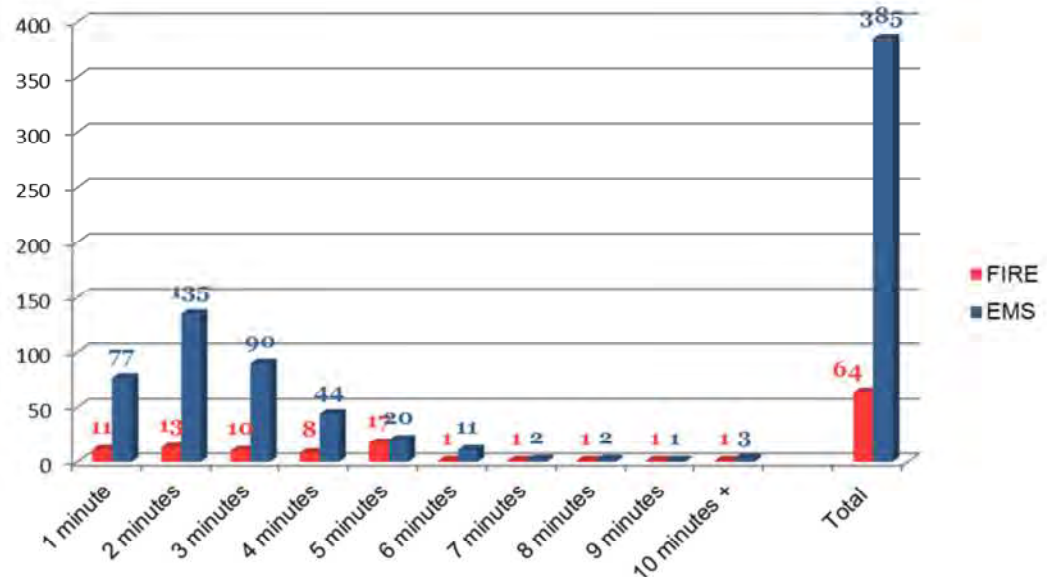


District Statistics



There were 449 responses in December. 62% percent of all responses were in District 1. Responses in District 3 and District 7 were 22% and 16% respectively.

Response Time

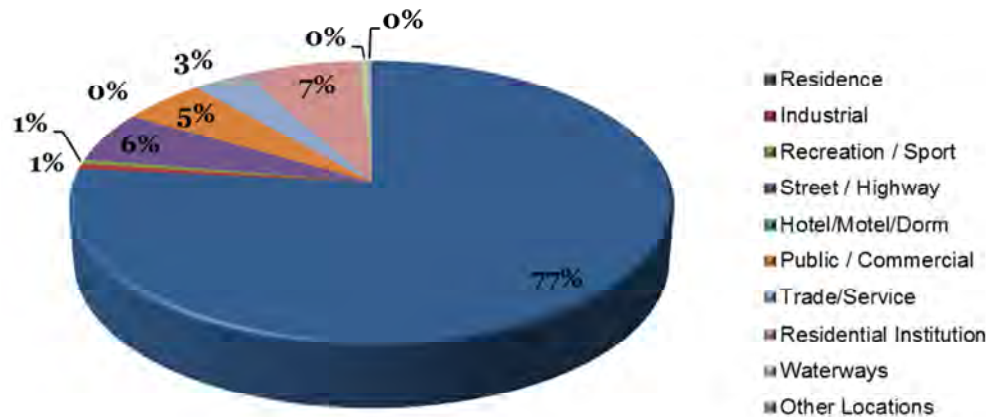


The average response time for fire emergencies was 4 minutes and 16 seconds. The average response time for EMS emergencies was 3 minutes and 1 second.

The Sandusky Fire Department responded to 52% of fire emergencies within four minutes and 81% of EMS emergencies within four minutes. This calculates to 87% of all emergency calls within four minutes.

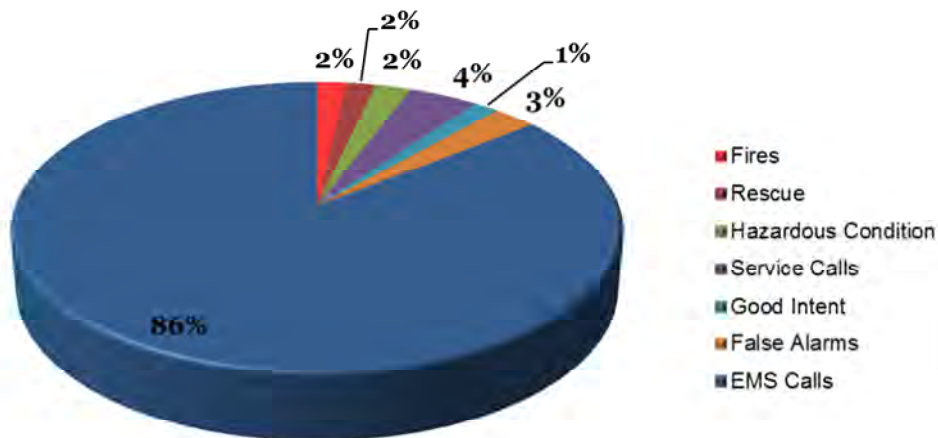


Response by Location



In December, 84% of all emergency responses were to residential occupancies (residences, nursing homes and residential institutions). Commercial buildings, recreational occupancies and streets and highways totaled 12%.

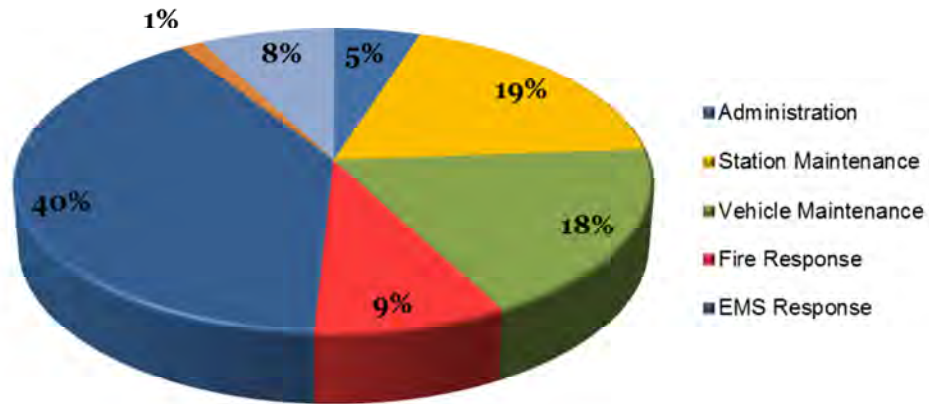
Incident Type



Ambulance service continues to be the highest requested service at 86%. Structure fire activity was 2% of all emergent activity. False alarms represented 3% of all December emergent activity. There was \$77,500 in fire loss.

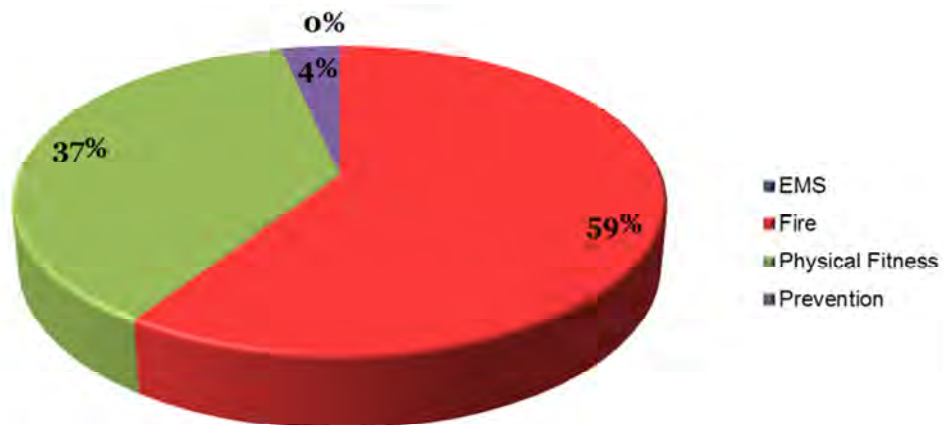


Activity



49% of all December activity was emergency response. Station and vehicle maintenance was 37% and training was 8%.

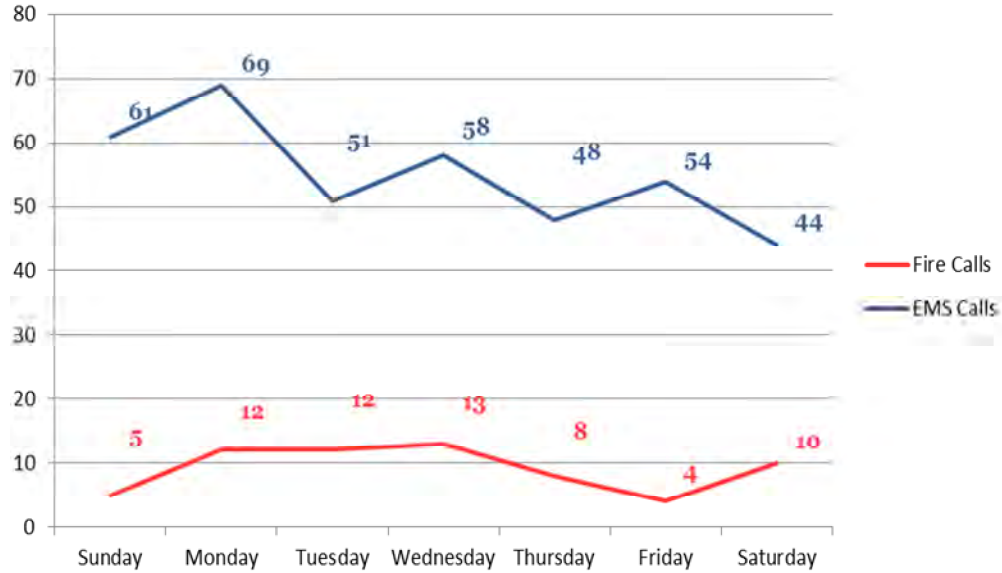
Training Analysis
