



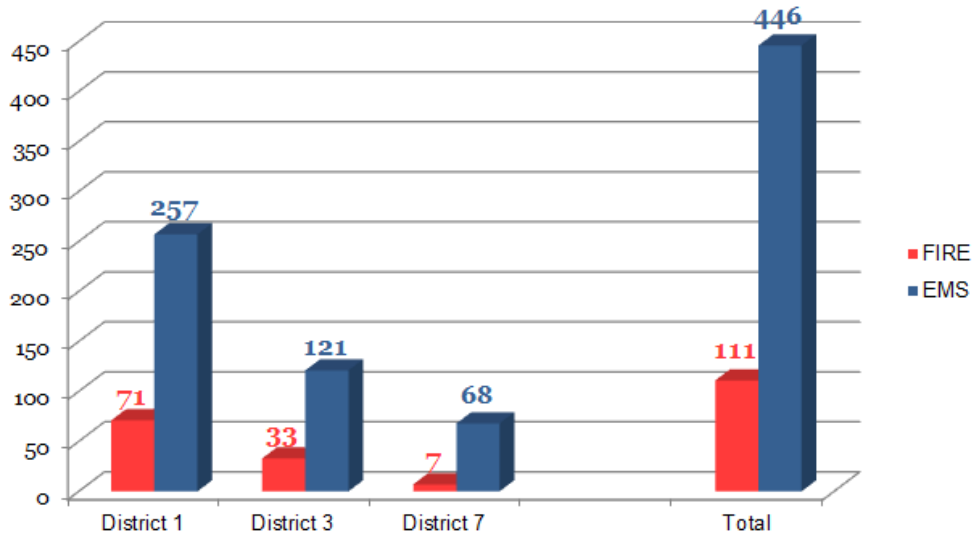

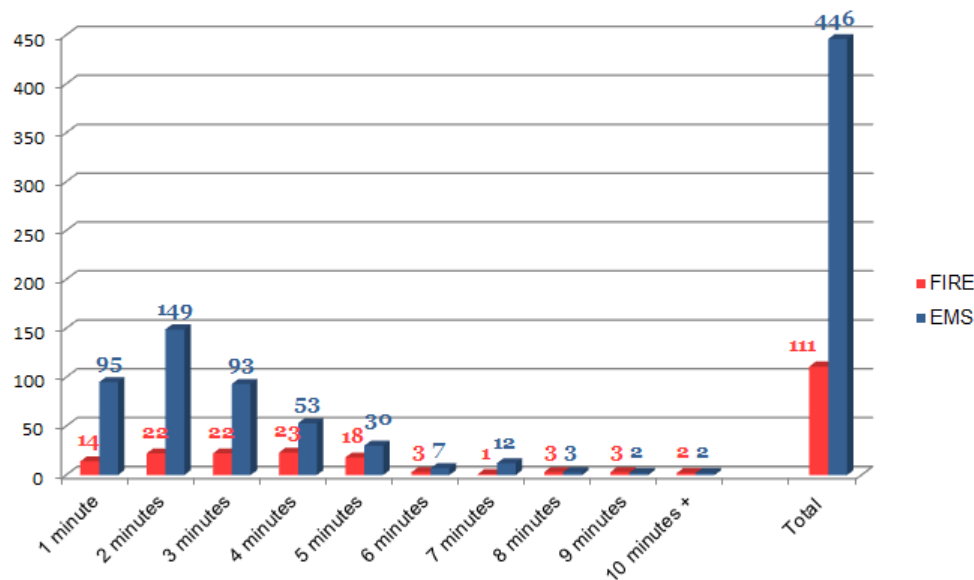


District Statistics



There were 557 responses in May. 59% percent of all responses were in District 1. Responses in District 3 and District 7 were 28% and 13% respectively.

Response Time

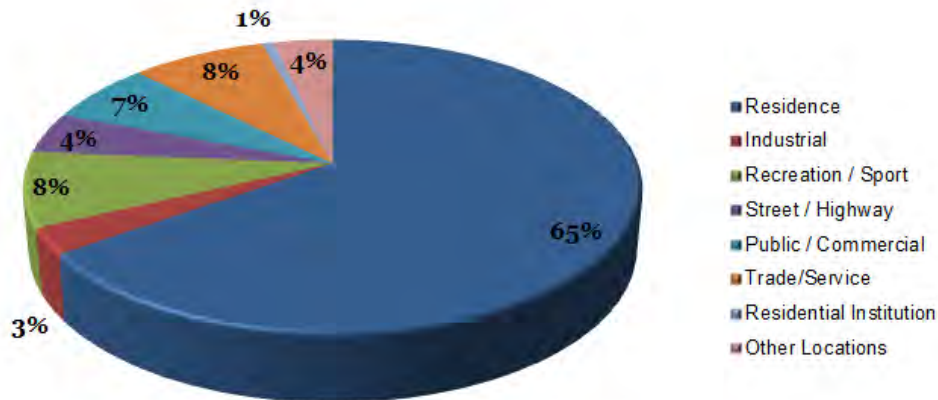


The average response time for fire emergencies was 4 minutes and 2 seconds. The average response time for EMS emergencies was 3 minutes and 9 seconds.

The Sandusky Fire Department responded to 72% of fire emergencies within four minutes and 88% of EMS emergencies within four minutes. This calculates to 85% of all emergency calls within four minutes.

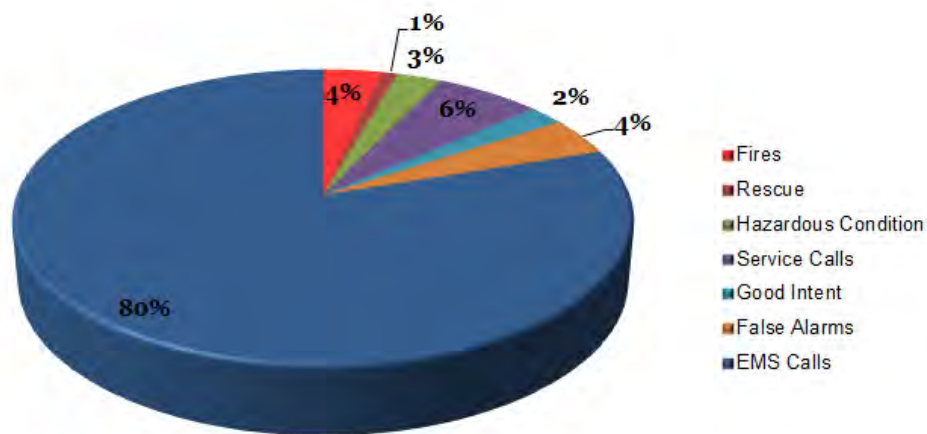


Response by Location



In May, 66% of all emergency responses were to residential occupancies (residences, nursing homes and residential institutions). Commercial buildings, recreational occupancies and streets and highways totaled 19%.

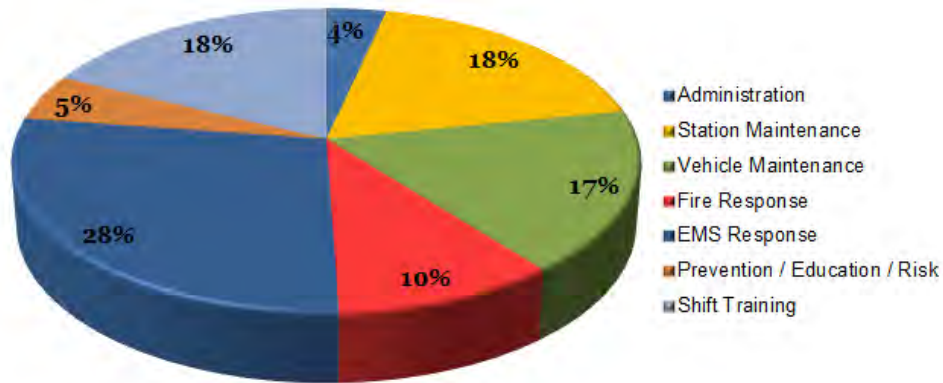
Incident Type



Ambulance service continues to be the highest requested service at 80%. Structure fire activity was 4% of all emergent activity. False alarms represented 4% of all May emergent activity. There was \$73,250 in fire loss.

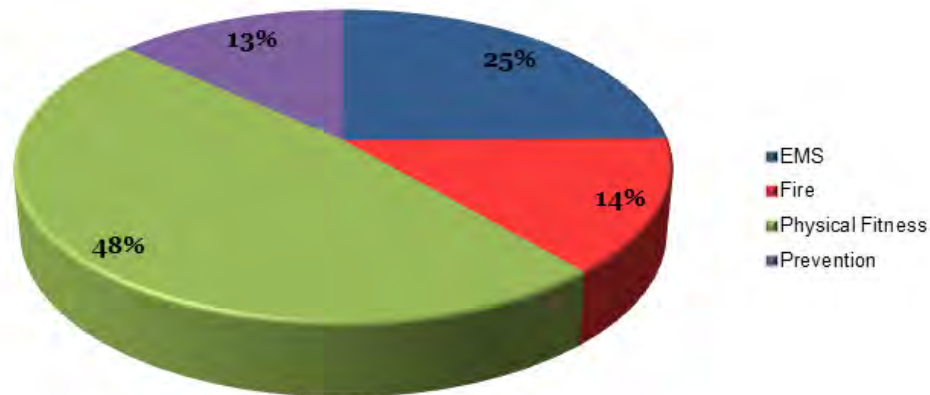


Activity



38% of all May activity was emergency response. Station and vehicle maintenance was 35% and training was 18%.

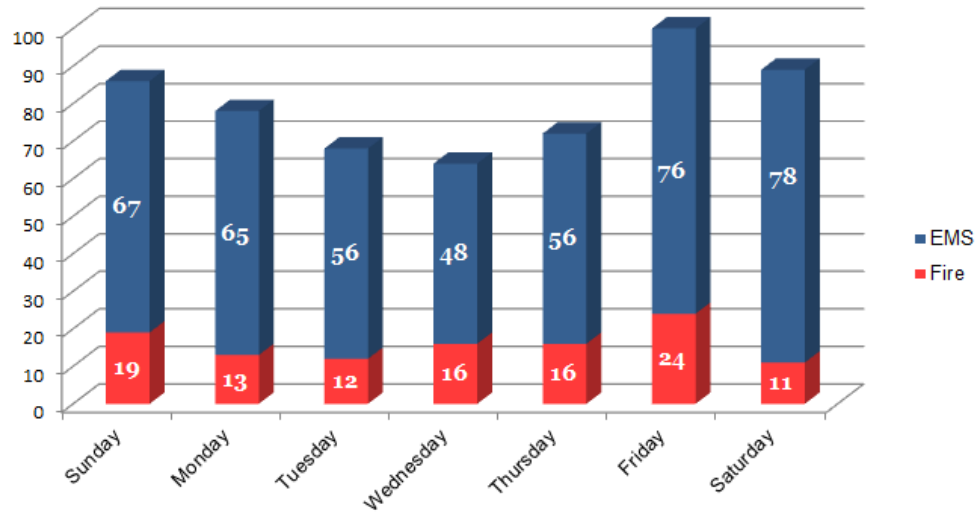
Training Analysis



48% of May training was physical fitness training. 14% was fire training with the focus on fire ground operations. 25% of training focused on EMS and the remaining 13% percent focused on prevention.
