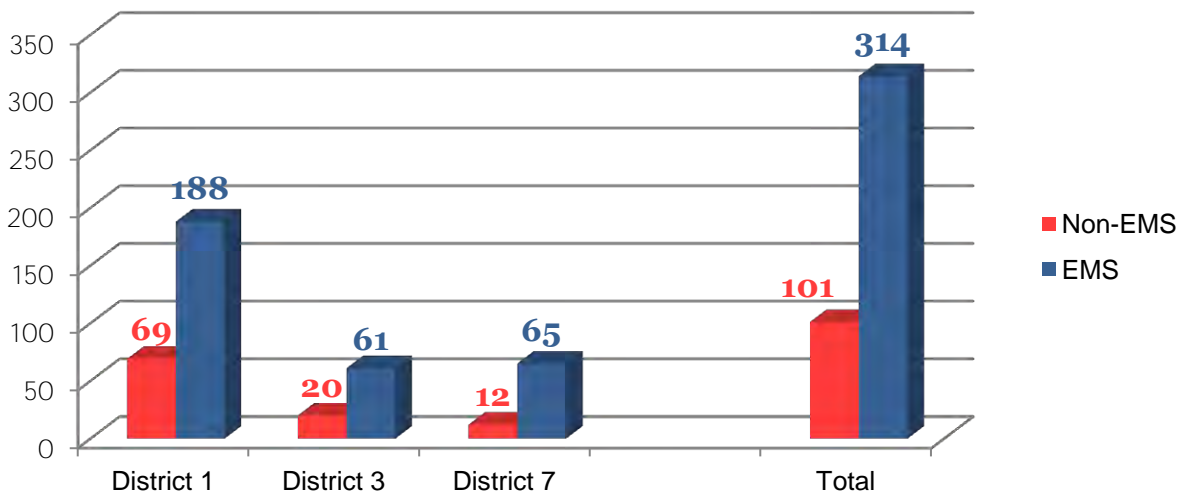

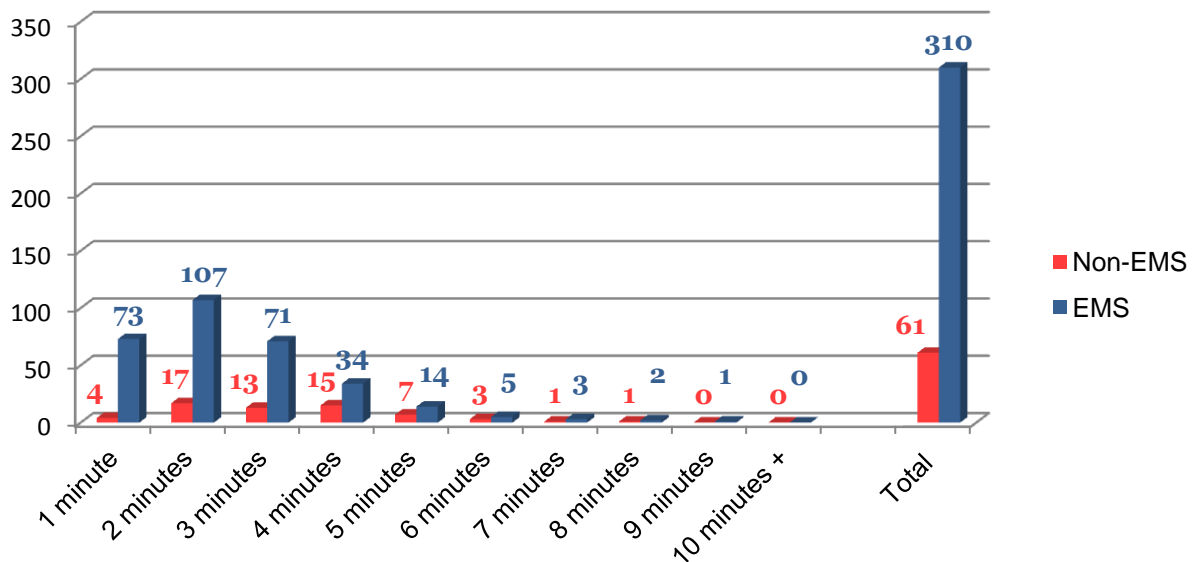


## District Statistics



There were 415 responses in March. 62% of all responses were in District 1. Responses in District 3 and District 7 were 19% and 19% respectively.

## District Statistics

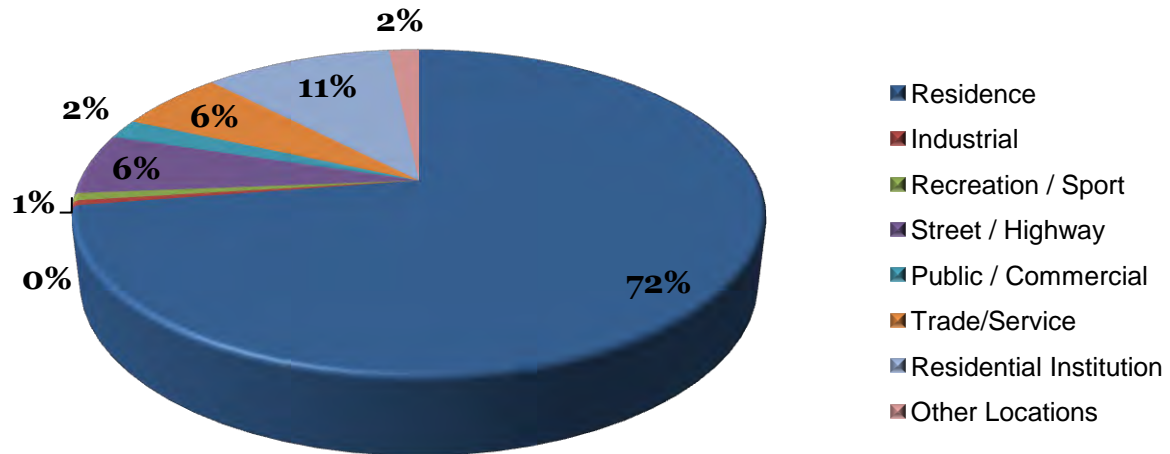


The average response time for fire emergencies was 3 minutes and 50 seconds. The average response time for EMS emergencies was 2 minutes and 55 seconds.

The Sandusky Fire Department responded to 80% of fire emergencies within 4 minutes and 92% of EMS emergencies within 4 minutes. This calculates to 90% of all emergency calls within 4 minutes.

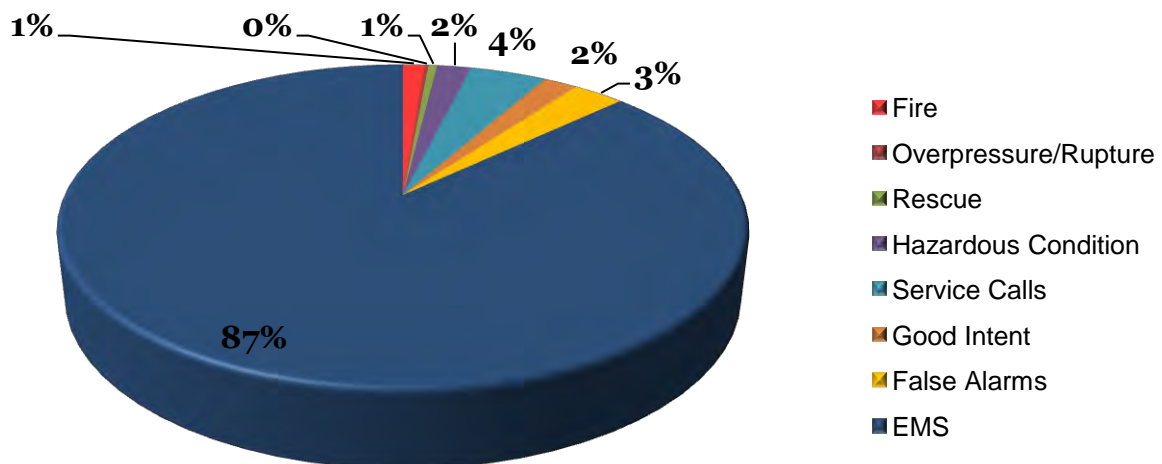


## Response By Location



In March, 72% of all emergency responses were to residential occupancies (residences, nursing homes and residential institutions). Commercial and recreational occupancies, streets and highways totaled 8%

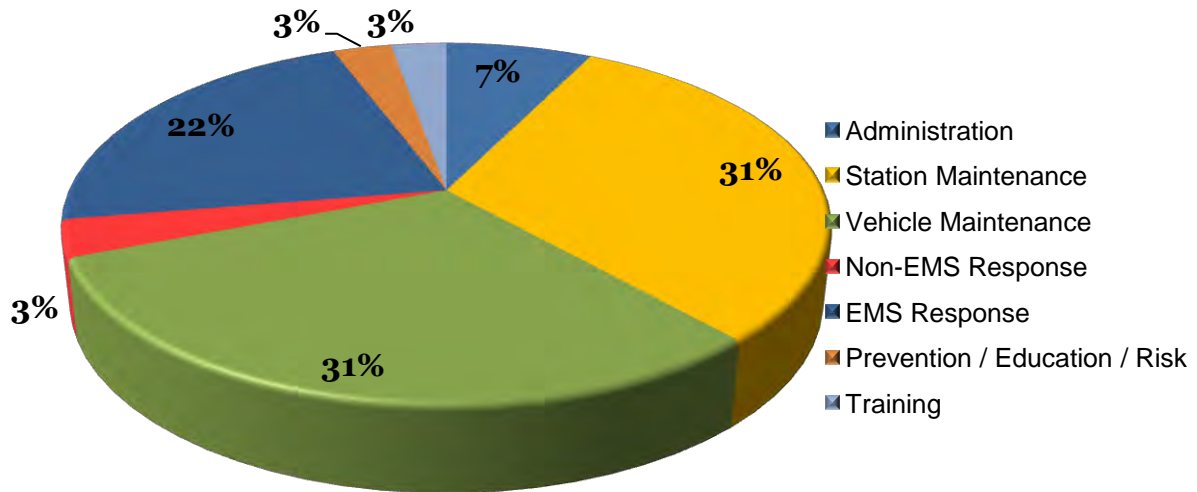
## Incident Type



Ambulance response continues to be the highest requested service at 87%. There was one kitchen fire reported in March. False alarms represented 3% of all emergent activity in March. There was \$3,200 in fire loss in March

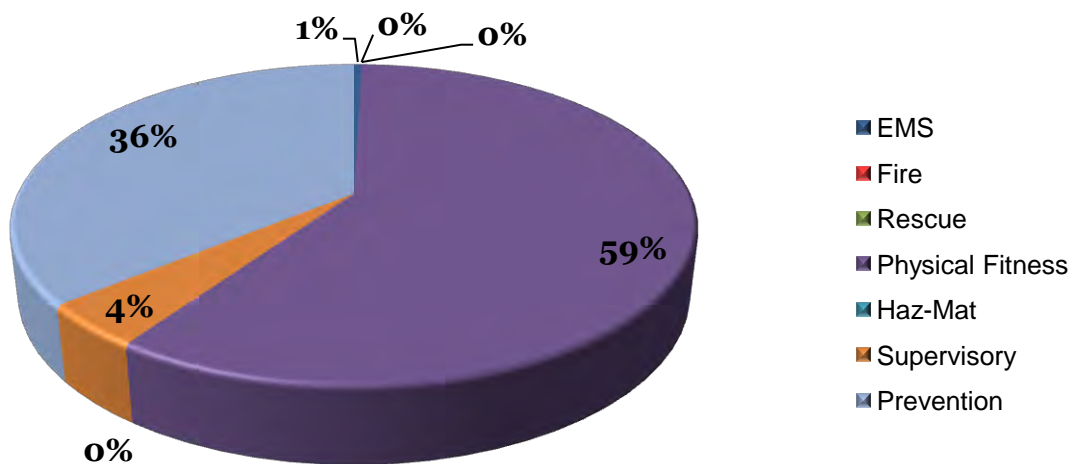


## Activity



25% of all March activity was emergency response. Station and vehicle maintenance was 62% and training was 3%.

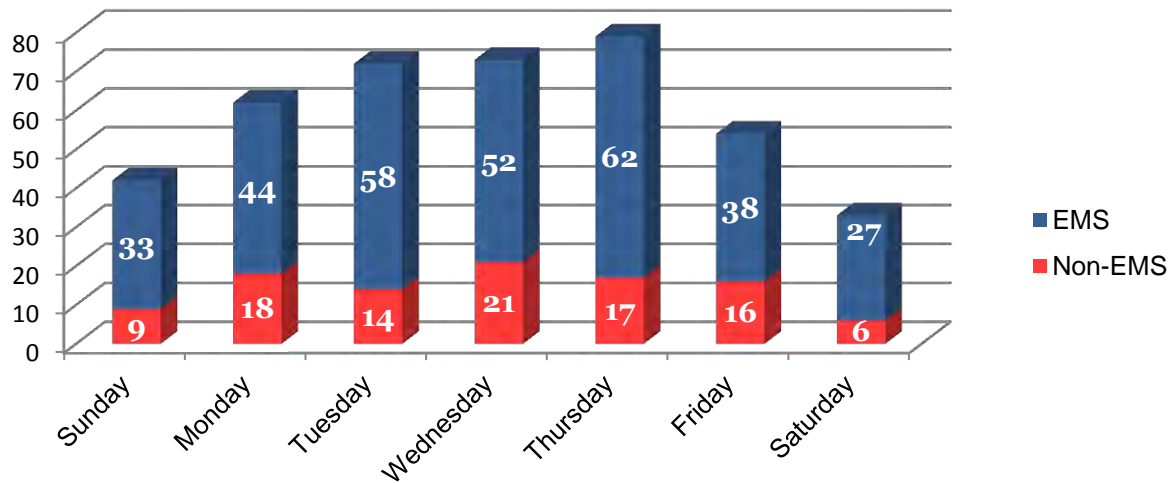
## Training Analysis



59% of March training was physical fitness training. 36% was on fire prevention and education and 4% on supervisory enrichment.

drop in a staffing level of 11 firefighters per day is supplemented with voluntary overtime call-in by off-duty personnel.

## *Mutual Aid:*
