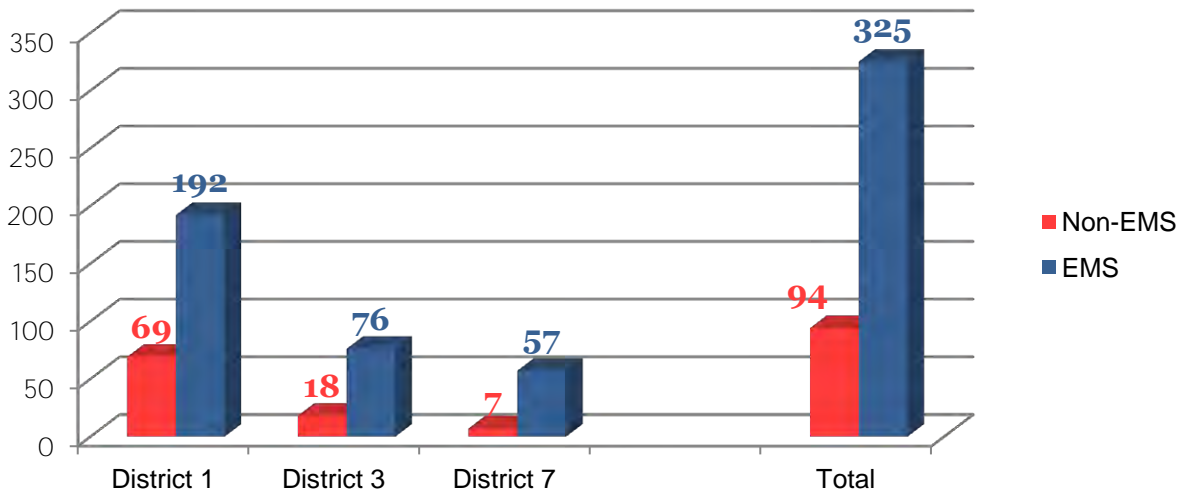

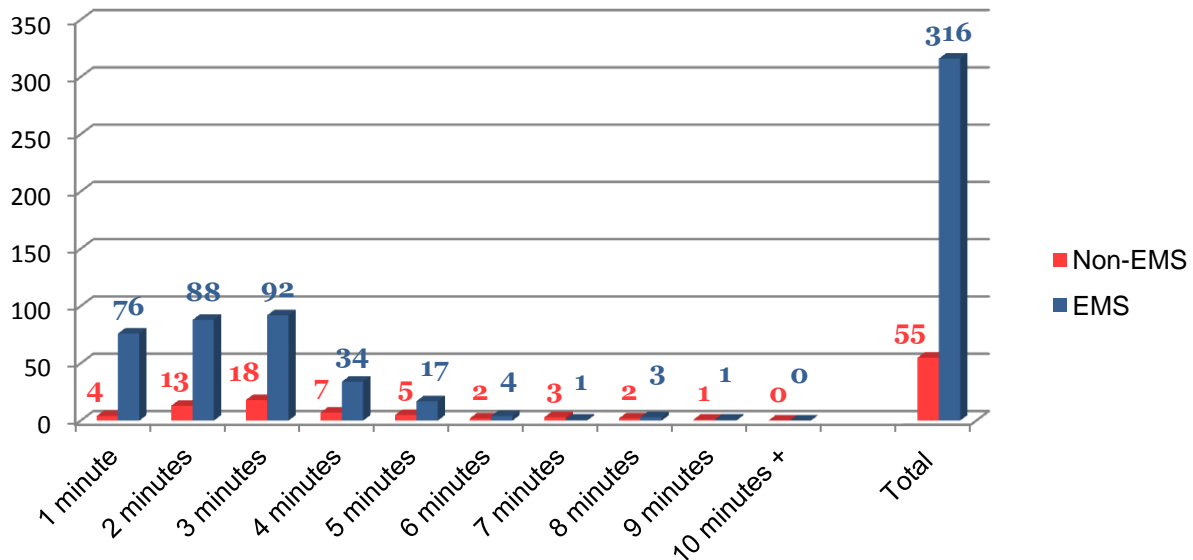


District Statistics



There were 419 responses in February. 63% of all responses were in District 1. Responses in District 3 and District 7 were 23% and 16% respectively.

Response Time

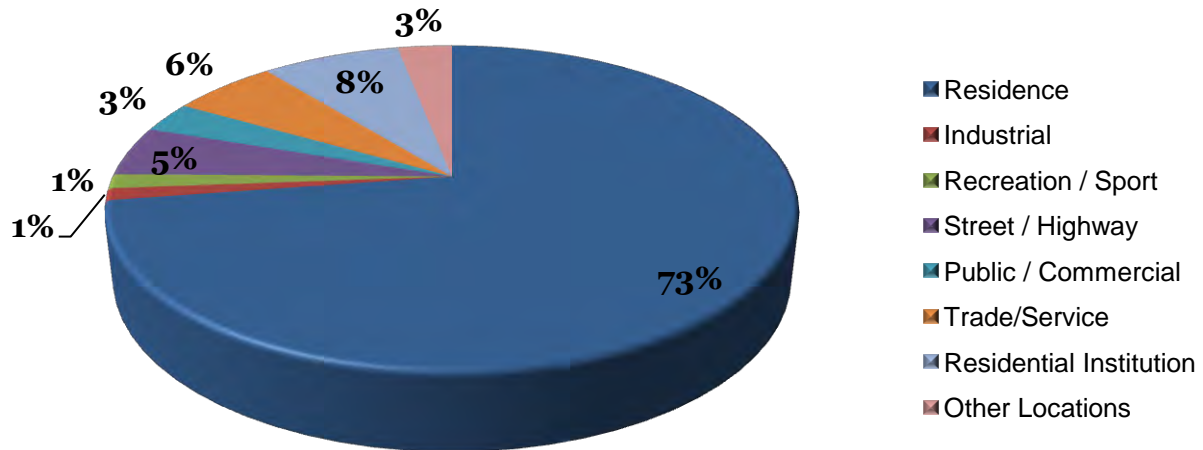


The average response time for fire emergencies was 4 minutes and 5 seconds. The average response time for EMS emergencies was 2 minutes and 59 seconds.

The Sandusky Fire Department responded to 76% of fire emergencies within 4 minutes and 92% of EMS emergencies within 4 minutes. This calculates to 89% of all emergency calls within 4 minutes.

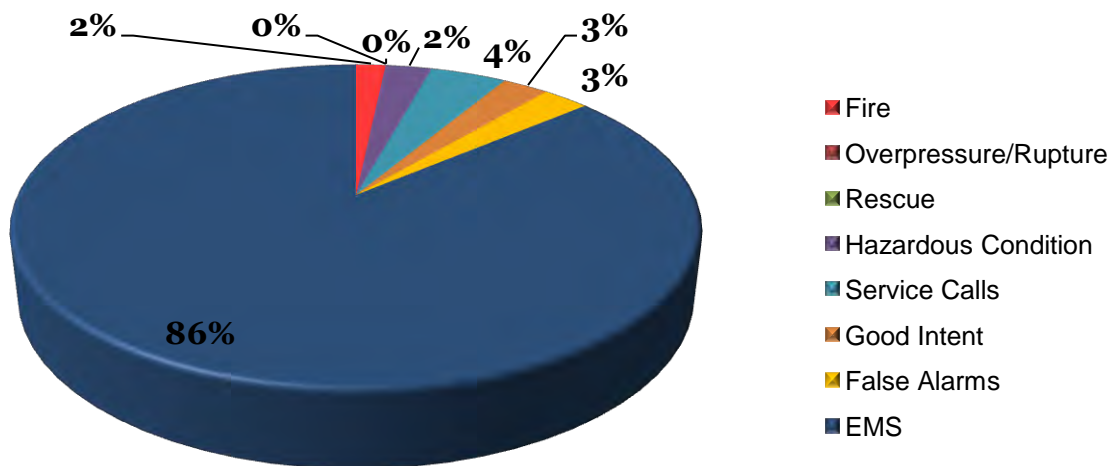


Response By Location



In February, 81% of all emergency responses were to residential occupancies (residences, nursing homes and residential institutions). Commercial and recreational occupancies, streets and highways totaled 9%

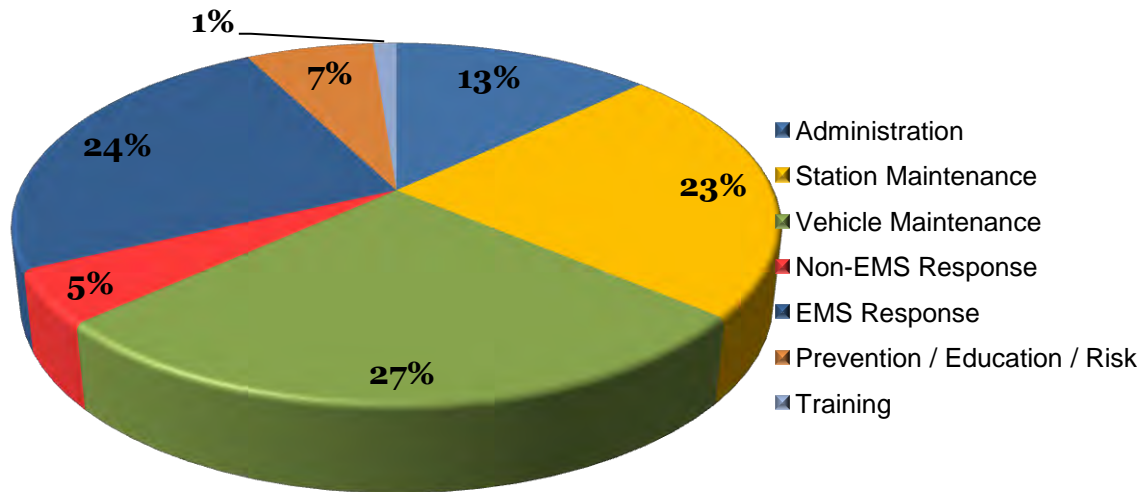
Incident Type



Ambulance response continues to be the highest requested service at 86%. There were 2 structure fires reported in February. False alarms represented 3% of all emergent activity in February. There was \$16,100 in fire loss in February.

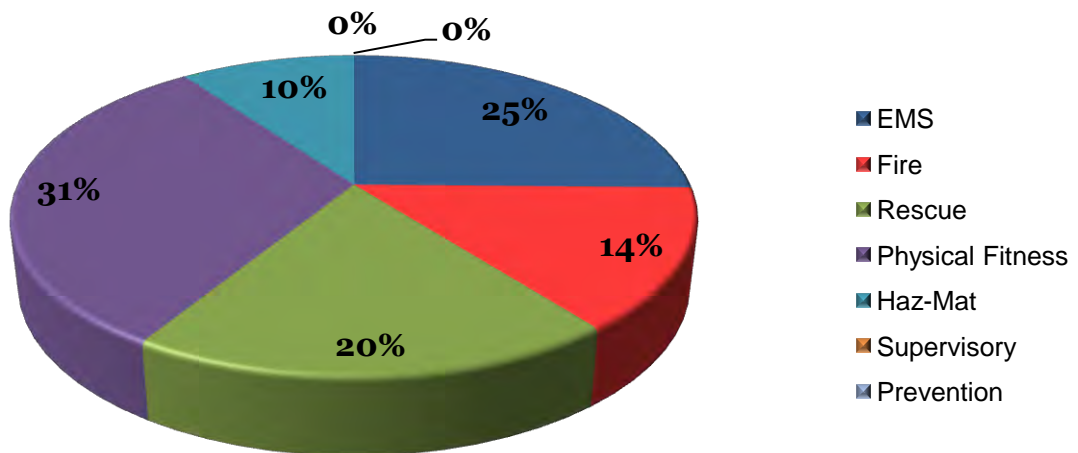


Activity



29% of all February activity was emergency response. Station and vehicle maintenance was 50% and training was 1%.

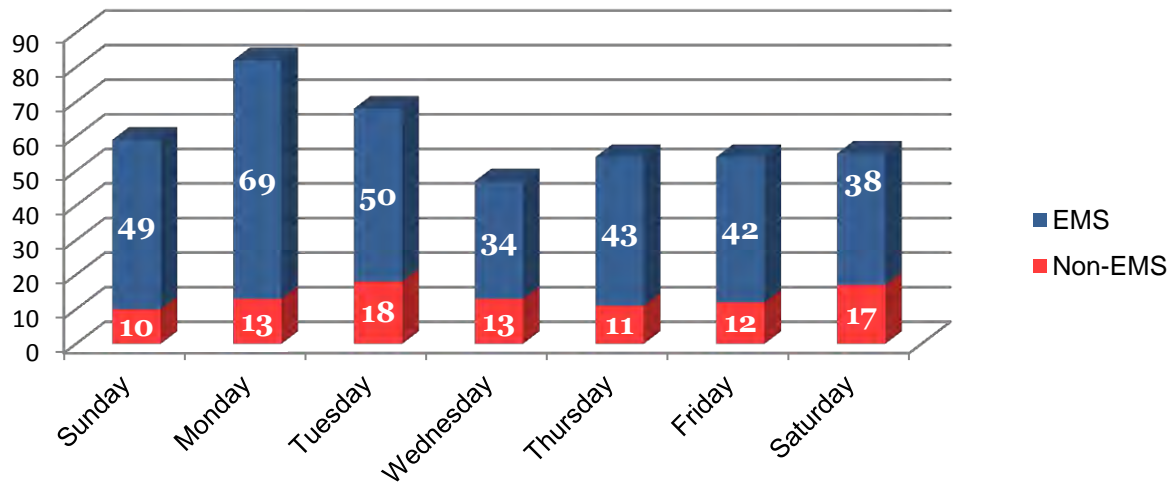
Training Analysis



31% of February training was physical fitness training. 10% was on fire prevention and education and 39% was on Fire and EMS continuing education.



Response By Day-Of-Week



Average Daily Staffing:

The Sandusky Fire Department maintained a regularly scheduled average daily staffing level of 11 firefighters. Any drop in a staffing level of 11 firefighters per day is supplemented with paid overtime call-in by off-duty personnel.

Mutual Aid:

The Sandusky Fire Department provided mutual-aid 2 times in the month of February to other agencies within Erie County.
