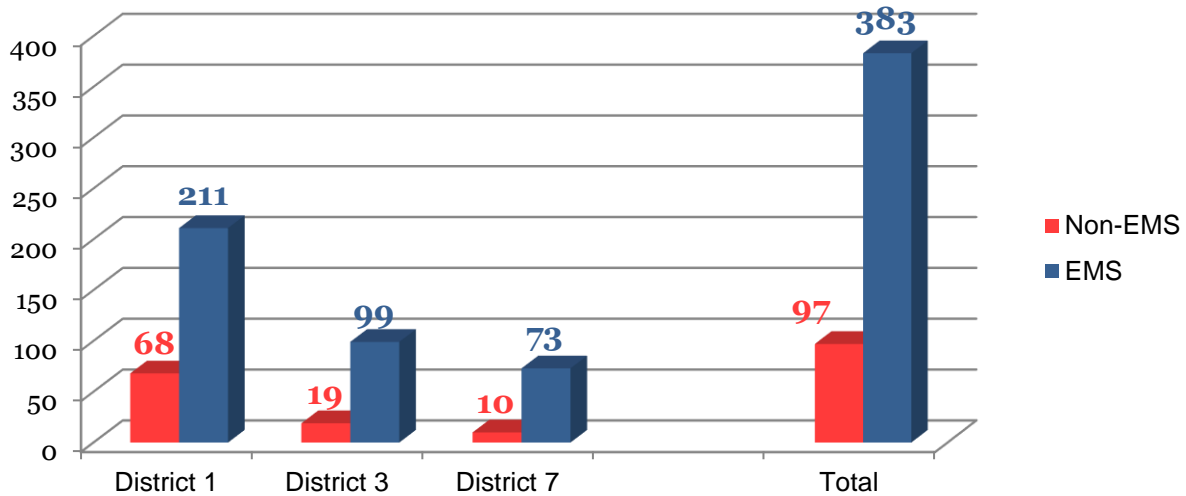

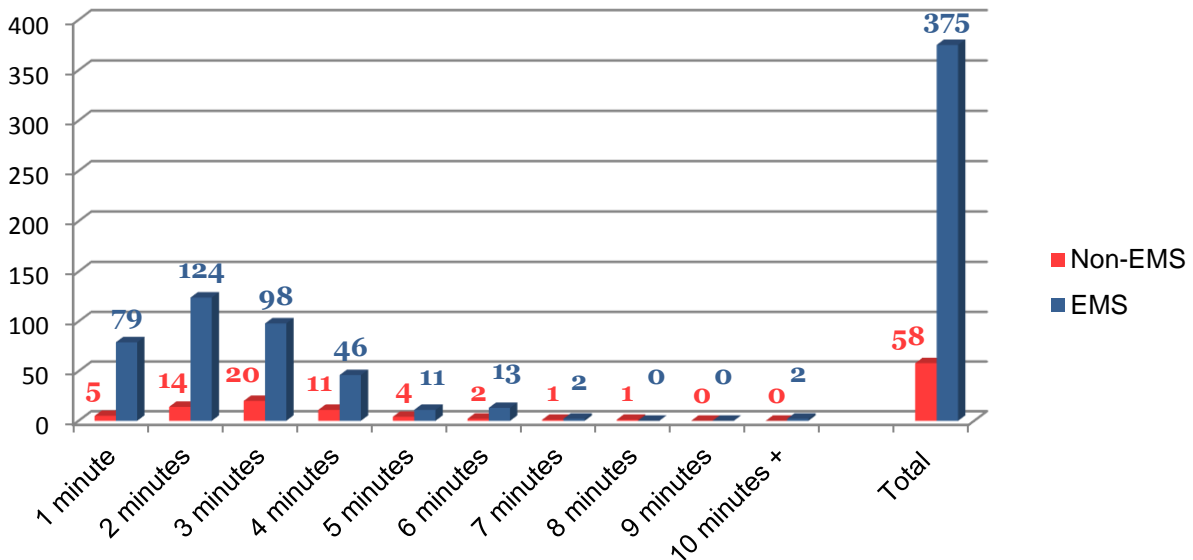


District Statistics



There were 480 responses in April. 58% of all responses were in District 1. Responses in District 3 and District 7 were 25% and 17% respectively.

District Statistics

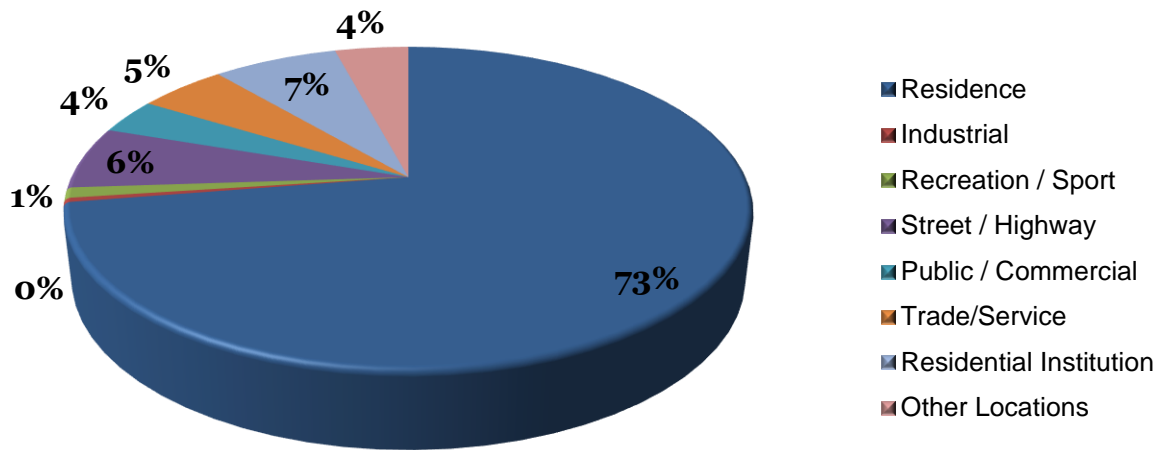


The average response time for fire emergencies was 3 minutes and 36 seconds. The average response time for EMS emergencies was 3 minutes and 2 seconds.

The Sandusky Fire Department responded to 86% of fire emergencies within 4 minutes and 93% of EMS emergencies within 4 minutes. This calculates to 89% of all emergency calls within 4 minutes.

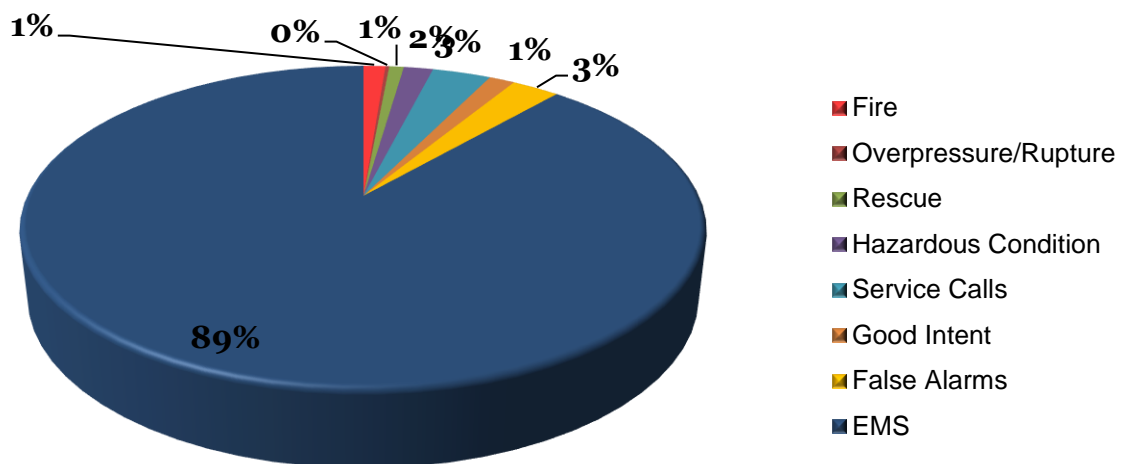


Response By Location



In April, 80% of all emergency responses were to residential occupancies (residences, nursing homes and residential institutions). Commercial and recreational occupancies, streets and highways totaled 20%

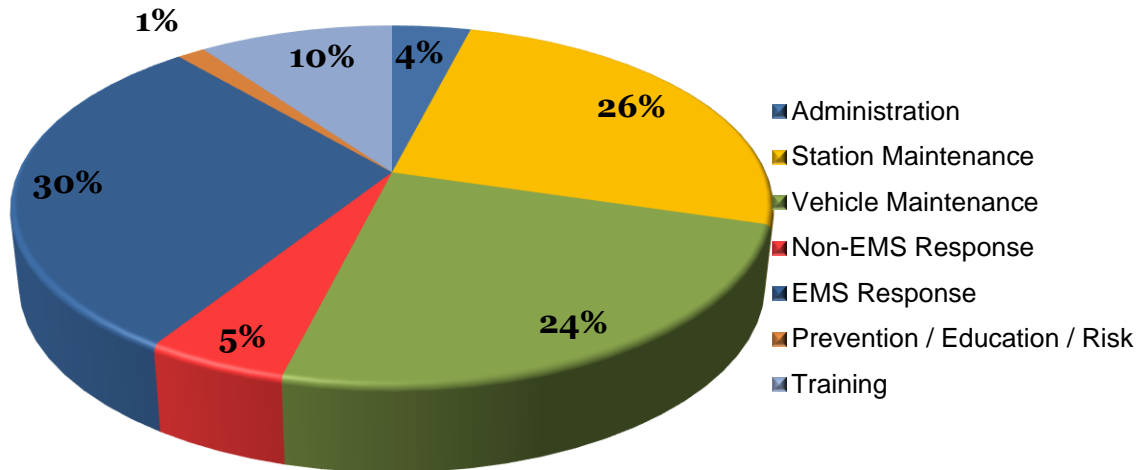
Incident Type



Ambulance response continues to be the highest requested service at 89%. There was one structure fire reported in April. False alarms represented 3% of all emergent activity in April. There was \$9,000 in fire loss in March

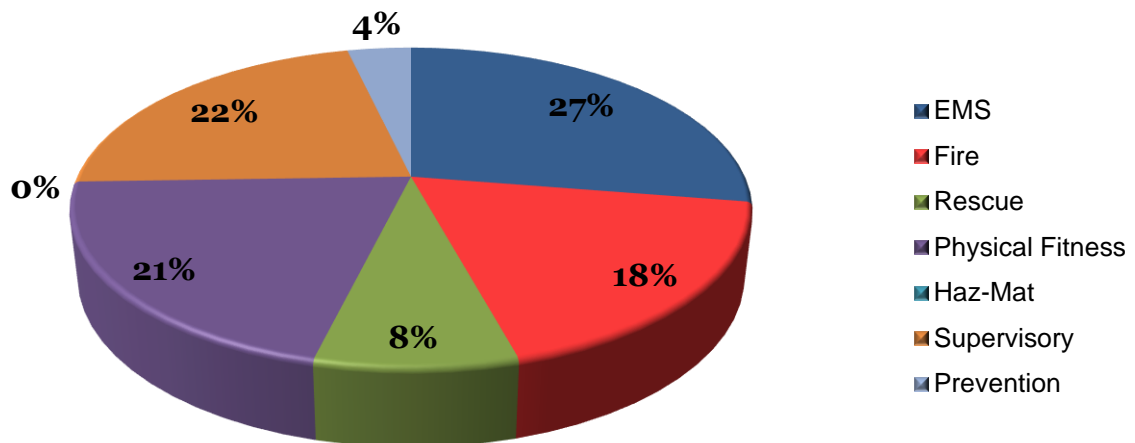


Activity



35% of all April activity was emergency response. Station and vehicle maintenance was 50% and training was 4%.

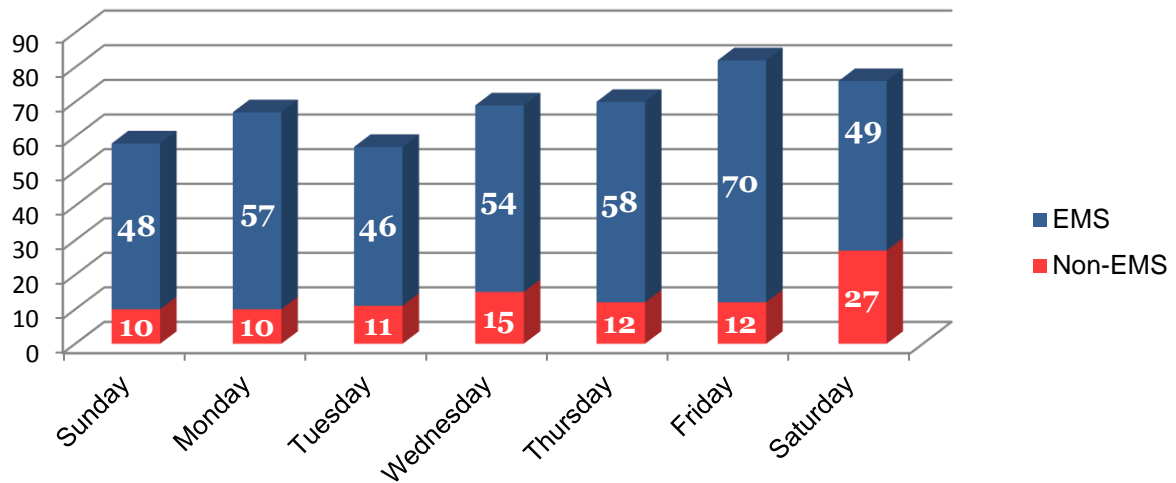
Training Analysis



22% of April training was physical fitness training. 49% was on fire prevention and education and 22% on supervisory enrichment.



Response By Day-Of-Week



Average Daily Staffing:

The Sandusky Fire Department maintained a regularly scheduled average daily staffing level of 11 firefighters. Any drop in a staffing level of 11 firefighters per day is supplemented with voluntary overtime call-in by off-duty personnel.

Mutual Aid:

The Sandusky Fire Department provided mutual-aid 3 times in the month of April to other agencies within Erie County.
