






Operational Reports Generated For The Month of May



There were 566 reports generated in August. 61% of all reports were for District 1. Reports for District 3 and District 7 were 23% and 16% respectively.

District Emergency & Non-Emergency Response-To-Scene Statistics




The average response-to-scene time for fire related calls was 3 minutes and 58 seconds. The average response time for EMS related calls was 3 minutes and 6 seconds.


The Sandusky Fire Department responded to 78% of fire related calls within 4 minutes and 88% of EMS related calls within 4 minutes. This calculates to 85% of all fire/ems related calls within 4 minutes.



Response By Location




In August, 65% of all department responses were to residential occupancies (residences, nursing homes and residential institutions).



EMS related calls continue to be the highest requested service at 82%. There were 3 structure fires reported in August. False alarms represented 5% of all emergent activity in August. There was \$178,500 in fire loss in the month August.




Monthly Staff Activity



48% of all August activity was fire/ems related calls. Station and vehicle maintenance was 39% and training was 13%.






Fire & EMS training comprised 84%. Physical fitness training comprised 15% of the total training hours for August.



Responses By Day-Of-Week



Average Daily Staffing:

The Sandusky Fire Department maintained a regularly scheduled average daily staffing level of 10 firefighters in August. Any drop in a staffing level below 11 firefighters per day is suplemented with voluntary overtime call-in by off-duty personnel.

Mutual Aid:

The Sandusky Fire Department provided mutual-aid 2 times and received mutual-aid 3 time in the month of August from other agencies within Erie County.
