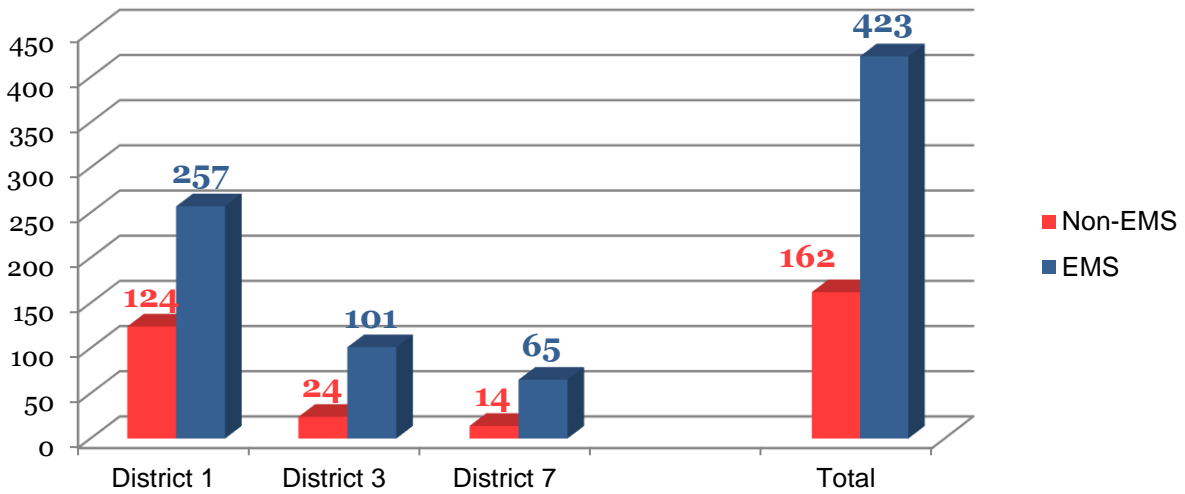

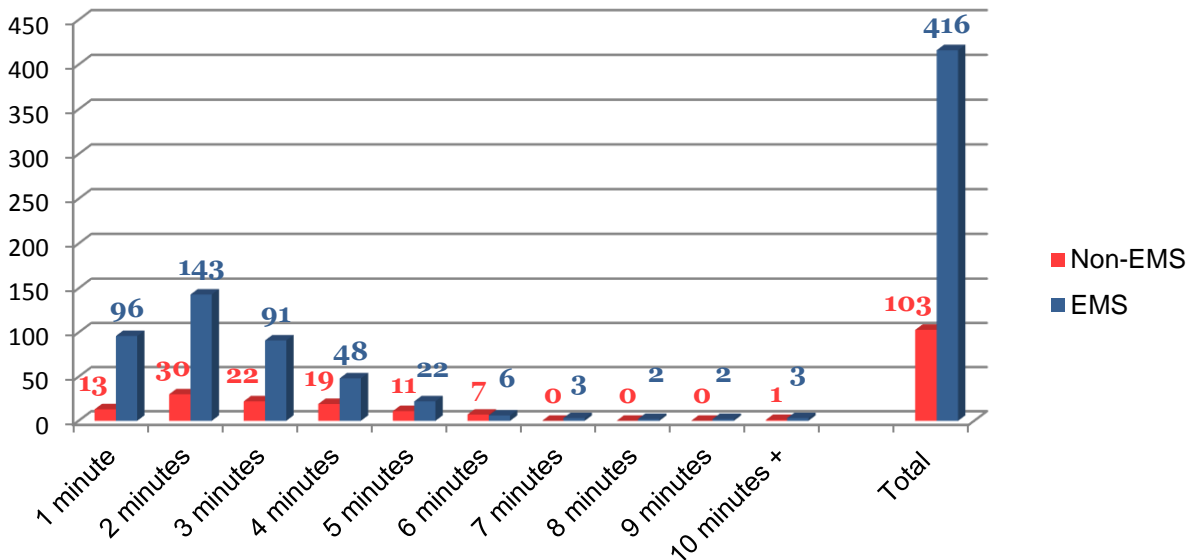


## Operational Reports Generated For The Month



There were 585 reports generated in September. 65% of all reports were for District 1. Reports for District 3 and District 7 were 21% and 14% respectively.

## District Emergency & Non-Emergency Response-To-Scene Statistics

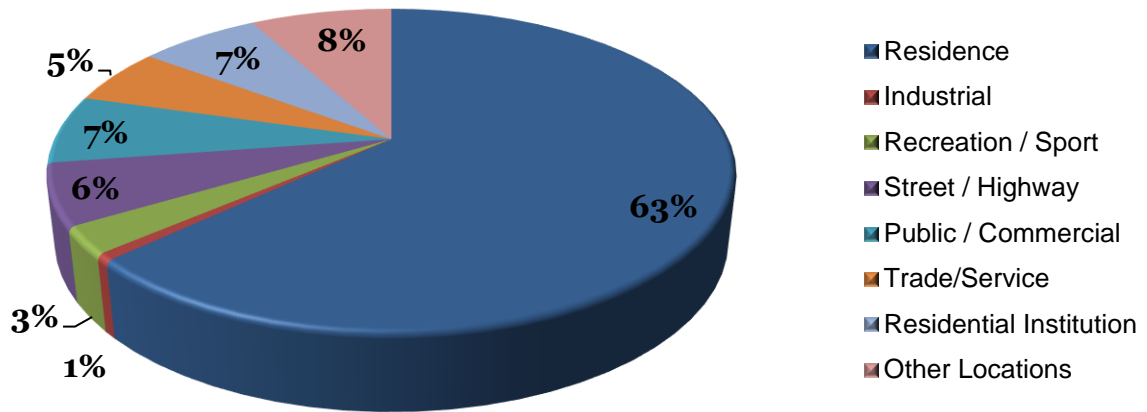


The average response-to-scene time for fire related calls was 3 minutes and 35 seconds. The average response time for EMS related calls was 3 minutes and 1 seconds.

The Sandusky Fire Department responded to 82% of fire related calls within 4 minutes and 91% of EMS related calls within 4 minutes. This calculates to 89% of all fire/ems related calls within 4 minutes.

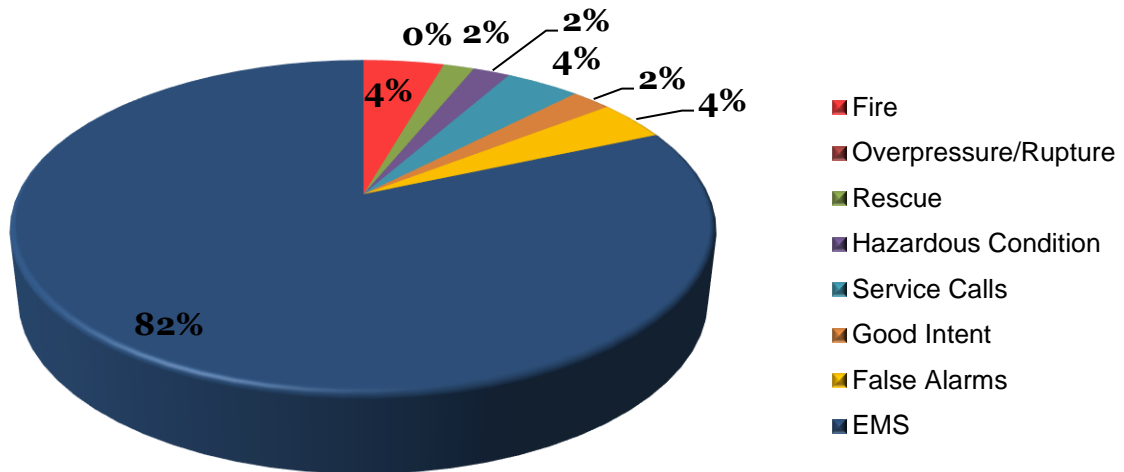


## Response By Location



In September, 63% of all department responses were to residential occupancies (residences, nursing homes and residential institutions).

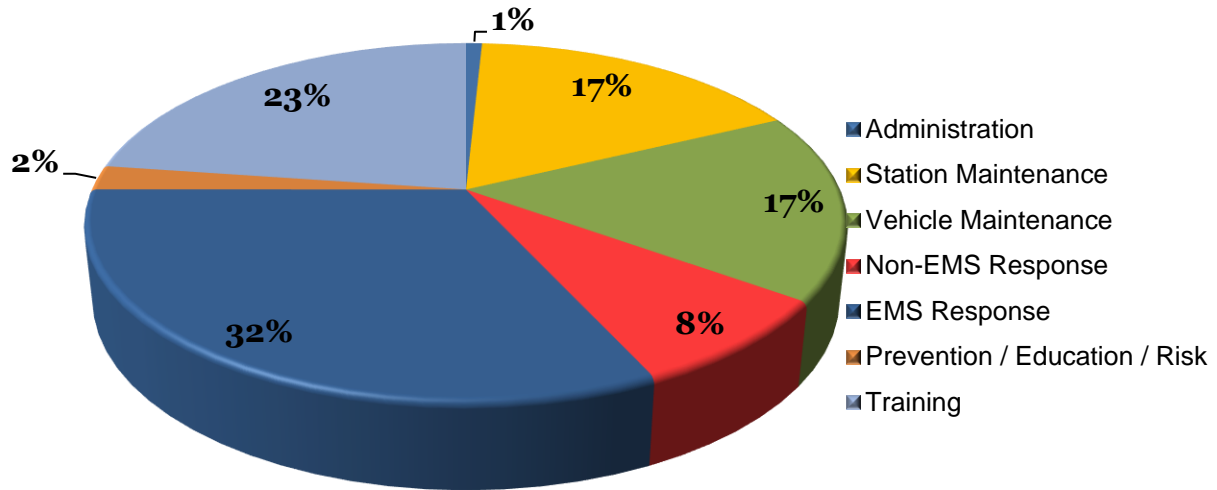
## Incident Type



EMS related calls continue to be the highest requested service at 82%. There were 3 structure fires reported in September. False alarms represented 4% of all emergent activity in September. There was \$13,550 in fire loss in the month September.

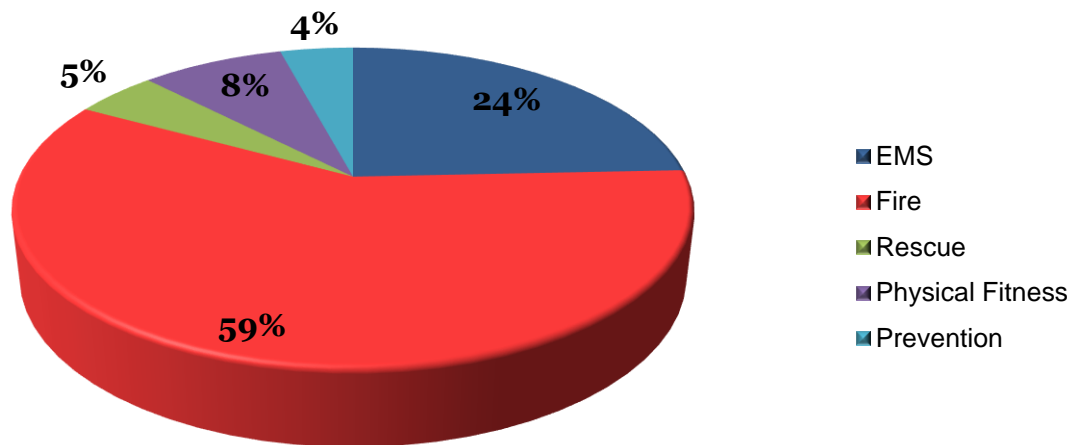


## Monthly Staff Activity



40% of all September activity included fire/ems related calls. Station and vehicle maintenance was 34% and training was 23%.

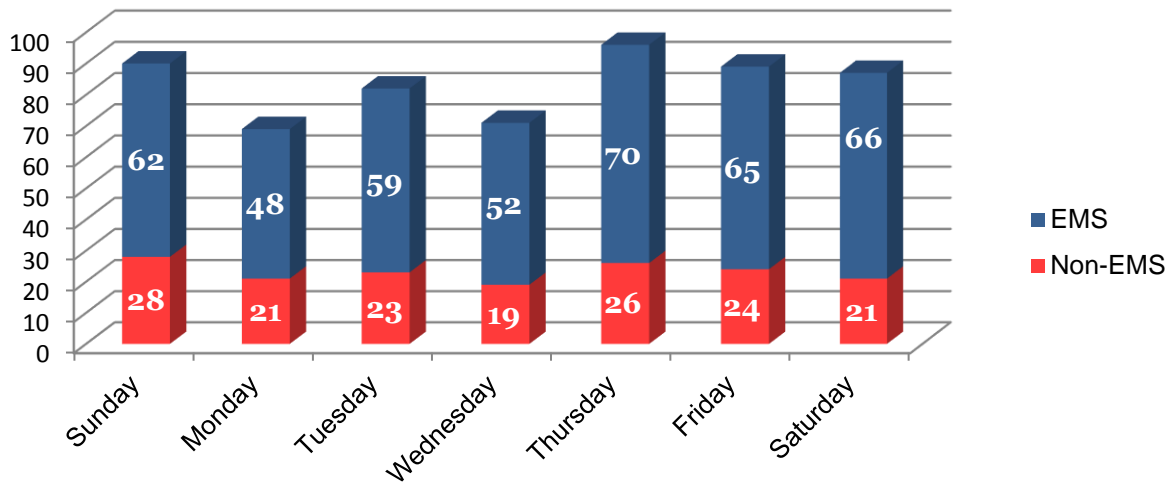
## Training Analysis



Fire & EMS training comprised 83%. Physical fitness training comprised 8% of the total training hours for September.

## *Average Daily Staffing:*

The Sandusky Fire Department maintained a regularly scheduled average daily staffing level of 10 firefighters in September. Any drop in a staffing level below 11 firefighters per day is supplemented with voluntary overtime call-in by off-duty personnel.

## *Mutual Aid:*

The Sandusky Fire Department provided mutual-aid 1 time and received mutual-aid 2 times in the month of September from other agencies within Erie County.
