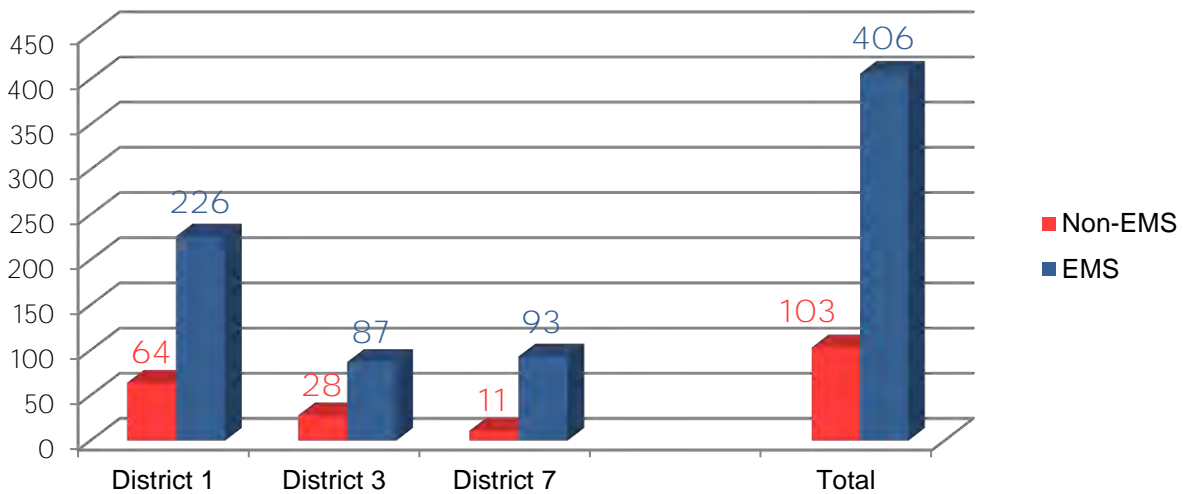

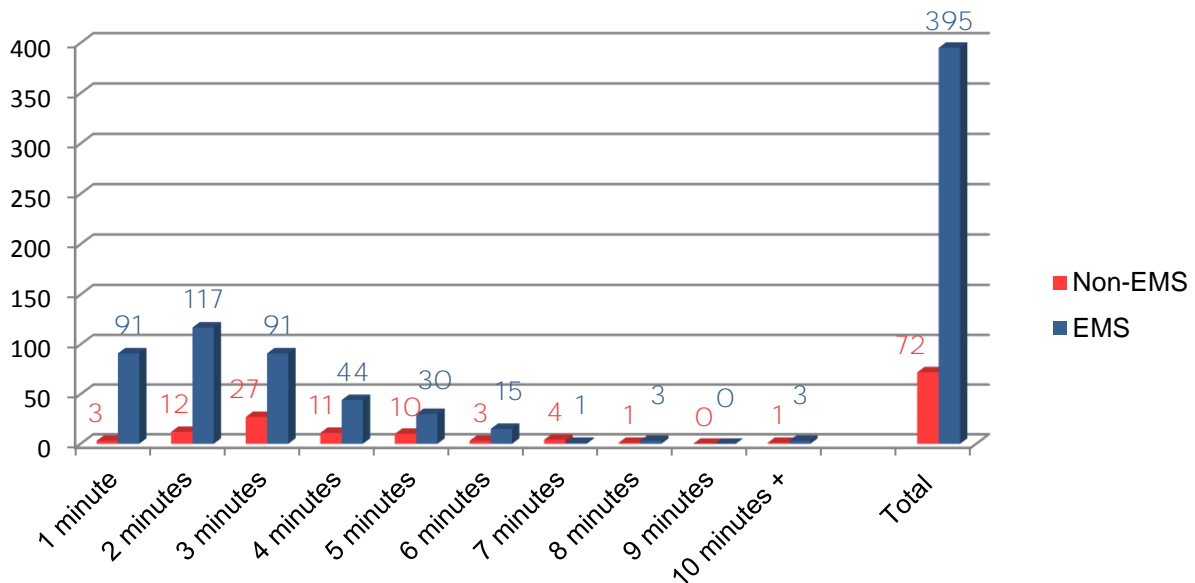


Operational Reports Generated For The Month



There were 509 reports generated in December. 57% of all reports were for District 1. Reports for District 3 and District 7 were 23% and 20% respectively.

District Emergency & Non-Emergency Response-To-Scene Statistics

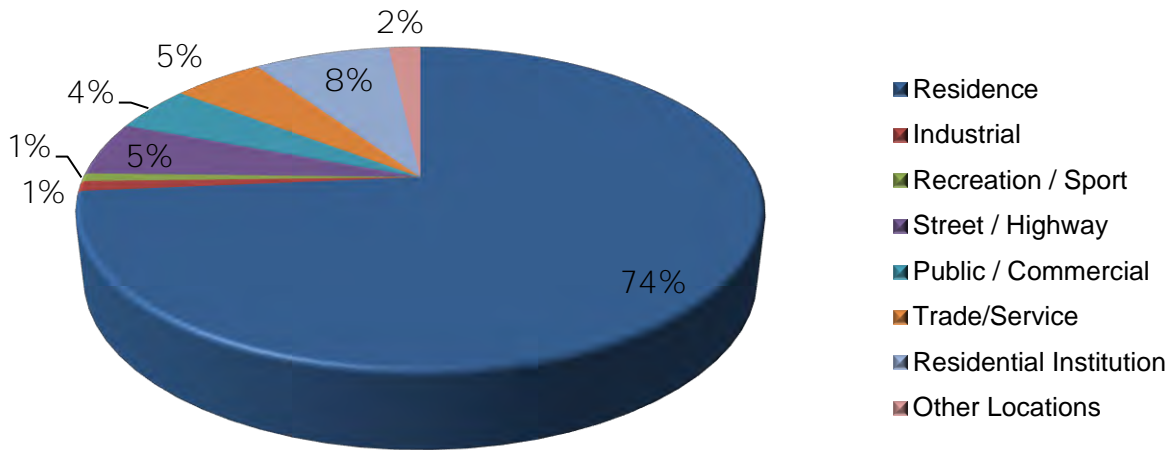


The average response-to-scene time for fire related calls was 4 minutes and 14 seconds. The average response time for EMS related calls was 3 minutes and 10 seconds.

The Sandusky Fire Department responded to 74% of fire related calls within 4 minutes and 87% of EMS related calls within 4 minutes. This averages out to 81% of all fire/ems related calls within 4 minutes.

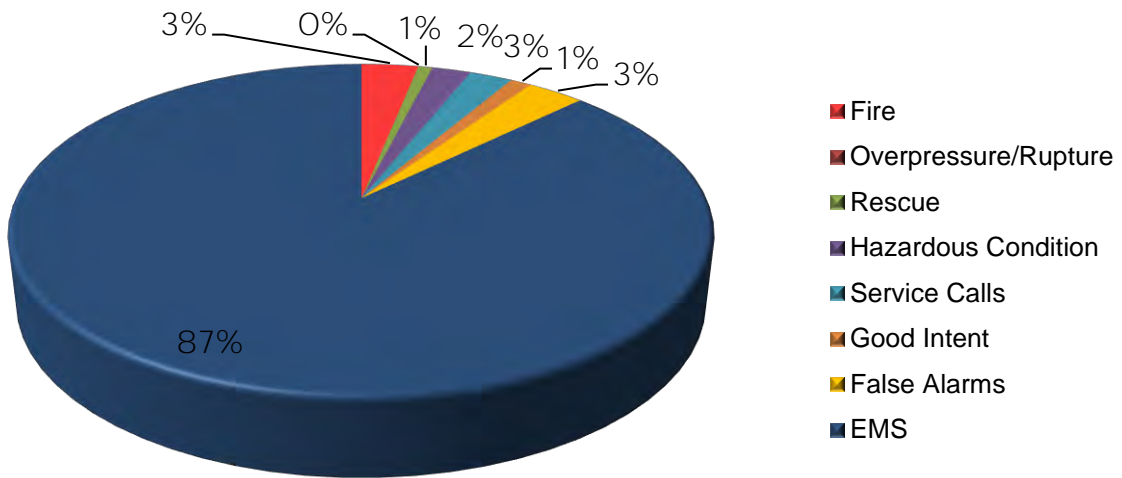


Response By Location



In December, 82% of all department responses were to residential occupancies (residences, nursing homes and residential institutions).

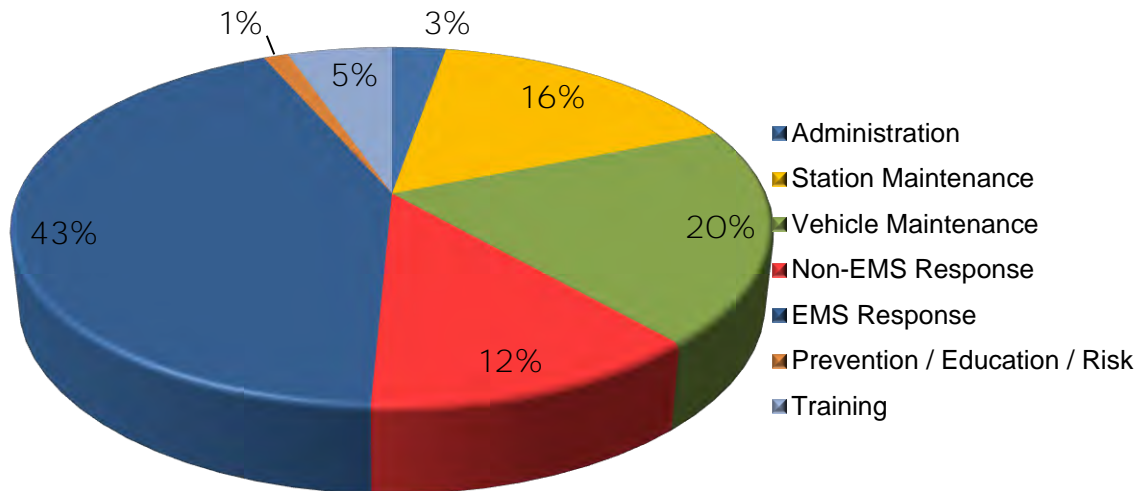
Incident Type



EMS related calls continue to be the highest requested service at 87%. There were 3 structure fires reported in December. False alarms represented 3% of all emergent activity in December. There was an estimated \$177,500 in fire loss in the month December.

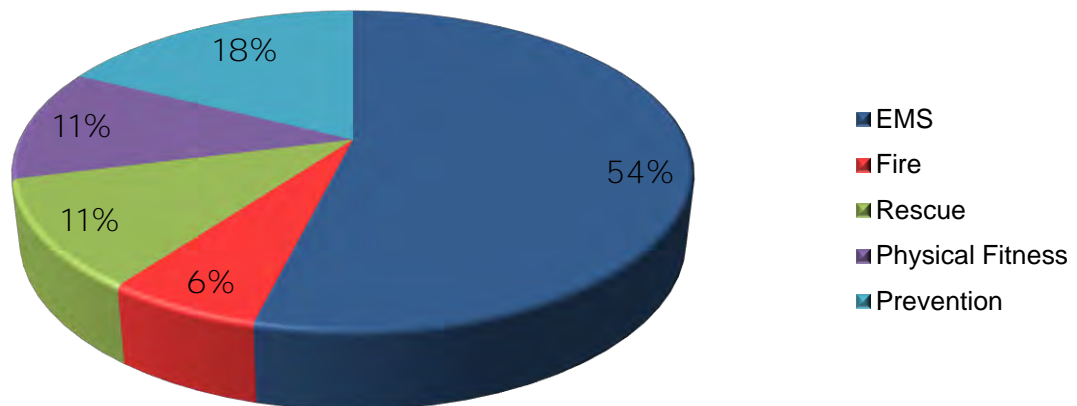


Monthly Staff Activity



55% of all December activity included fire/ems related calls. Station/Vehicle maintenance was 36% and training accounted for 5% of all staff activity.

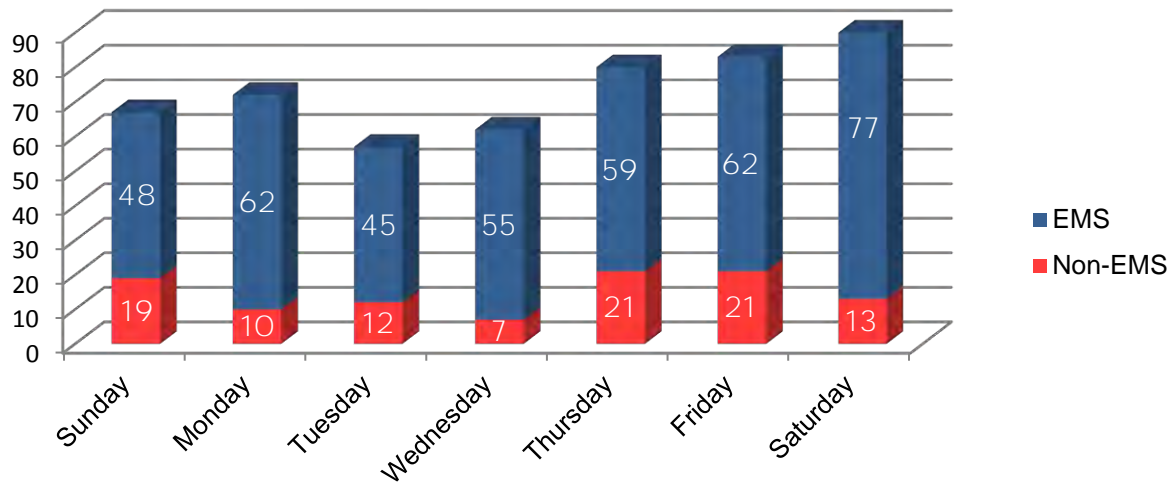
Training Analysis



Fire & EMS training comprised 60%. Physical fitness training comprised 11% of the total training hours for December.



Responses By Day-Of-Week



Average Daily Staffing:

The Sandusky Fire Department maintained a regularly scheduled average daily staffing level of 10 firefighters in December. Any drop in a staffing level below 11 firefighters per day is supplemented with voluntary overtime call-in by off-duty personnel.

Mutual Aid:

The Sandusky Fire Department provided mutual-aid 8 times and received mutual-aid 3 times in the month of December from other agencies within Erie County.
