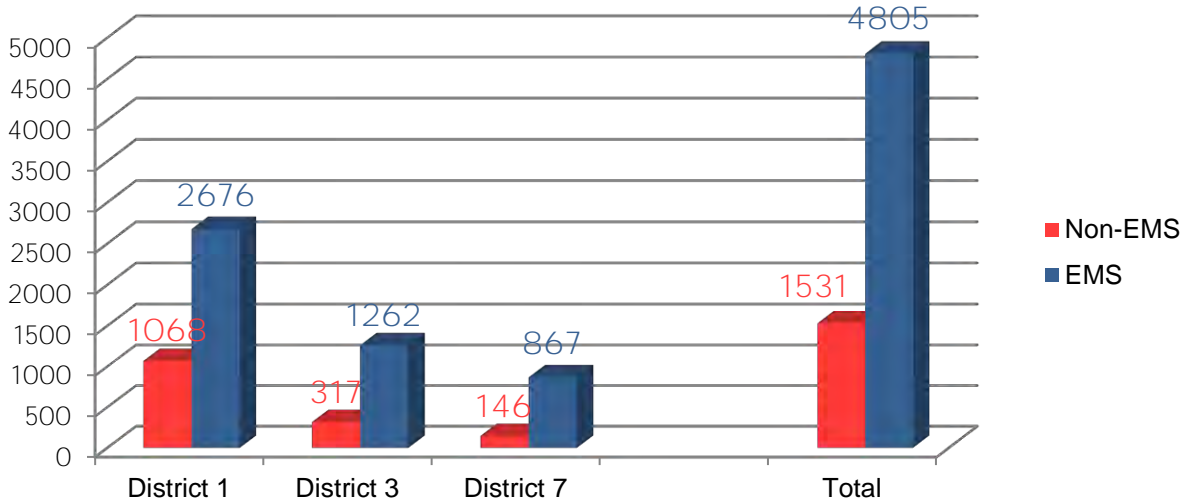

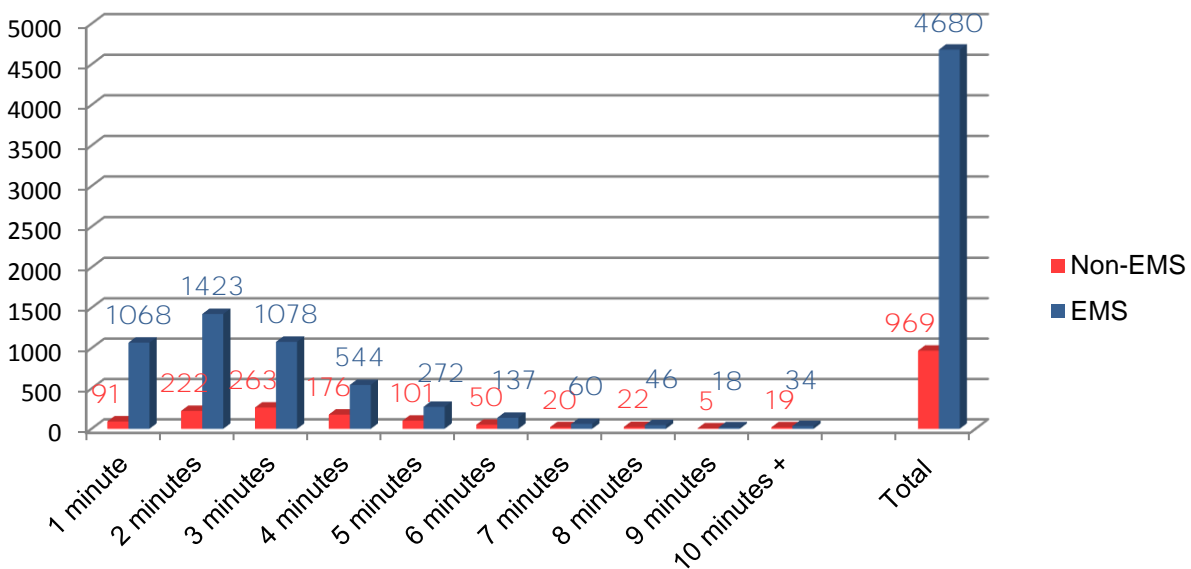


Operational Reports Generated For The Year



There were 6336 reports generated in 2016. 59% of all reports were for District 1. Reports for District 3 and District 7 were 25% and 16% respectively.

District Emergency & Non-Emergency Response-To-Scene Statistics

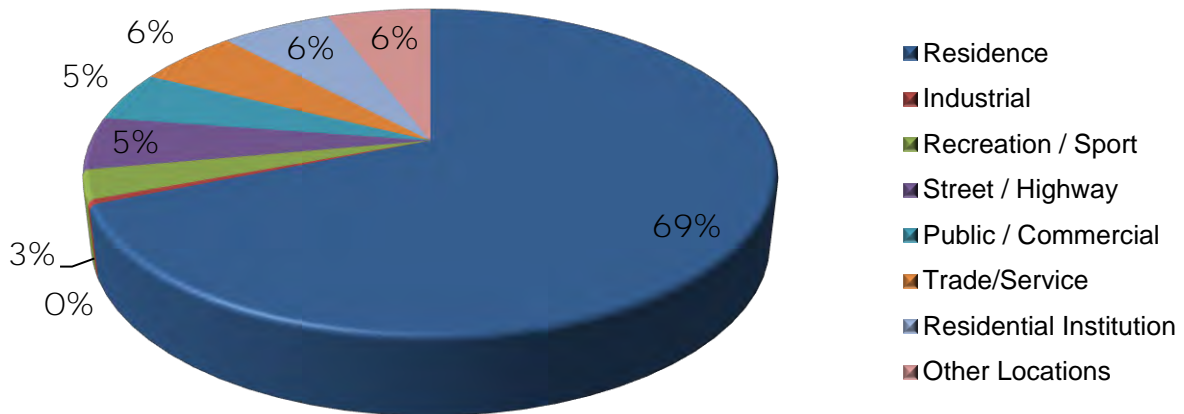


The average response-to-scene time for fire related calls was 4 minutes and 01 seconds. The average response time for EMS related calls was 3 minutes and 09 seconds.

The Sandusky Fire Department responded to 78% of fire related calls within 4 minutes and 88% of EMS related calls within 4 minutes. This averages out to 83% of all fire/ems related calls within 4 minutes.

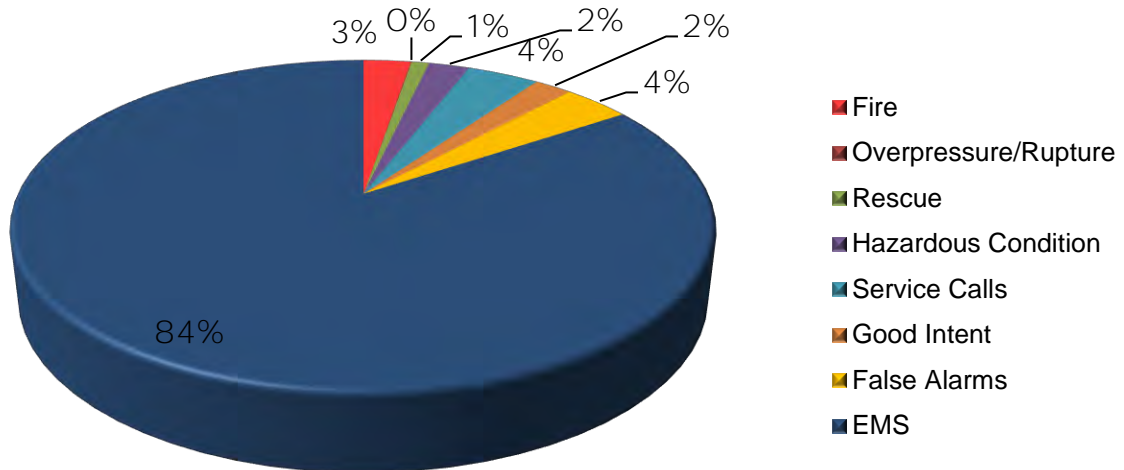


Response By Location



In 2016, 75% of all department responses were to residential occupancies (residences, nursing homes and residential institutions).

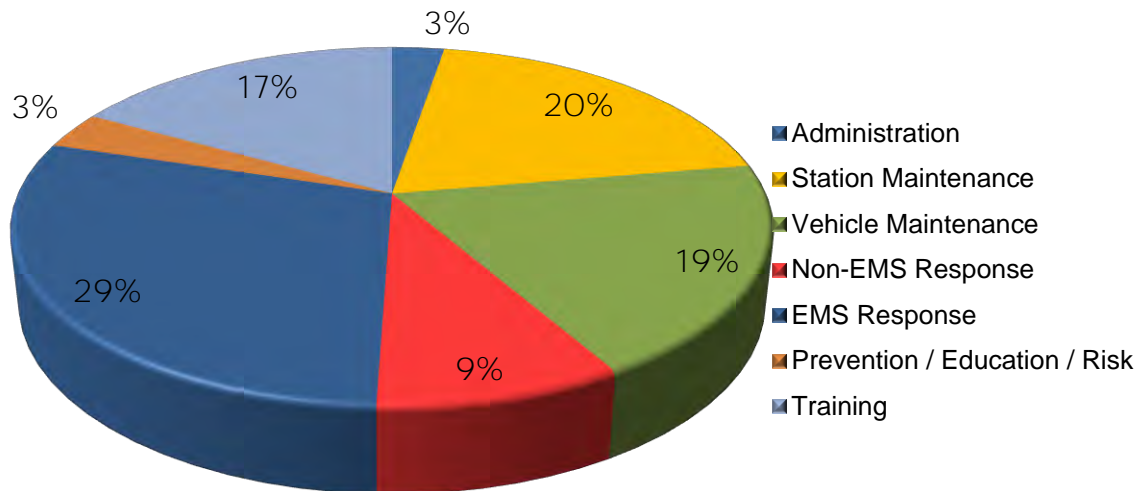
Incident Type



EMS related calls continue to be the highest requested service at 84%. There were 44 structure fires reported in 2016. False alarms represented 4% of all emergent activity in 2016. There was an estimated \$6,844,650 in fire loss in 2016.

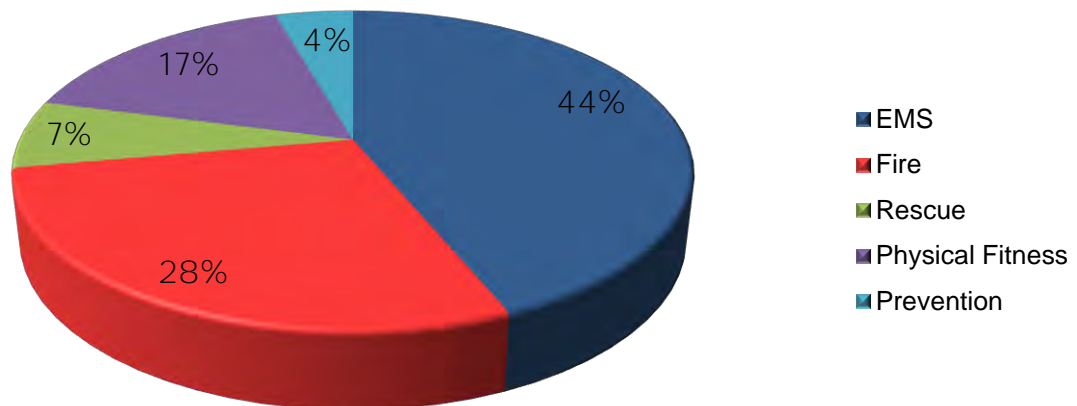


2016 Staff Activity



38% of all 2016 activity included fire/ems related calls. Station/Vehicle maintenance was 39% and training was 17%.

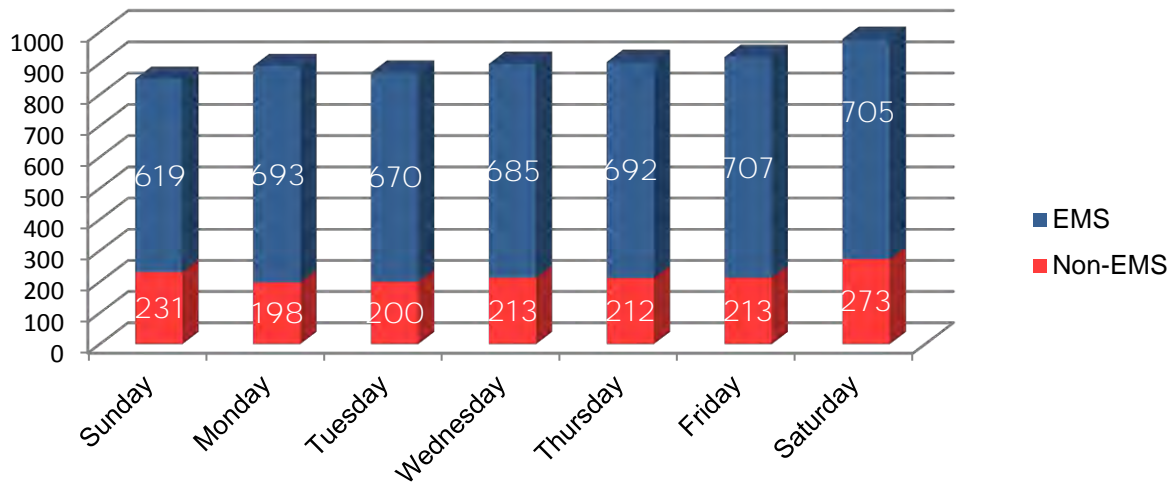
Training Analysis



Fire & EMS training comprised 72% of all training related activities for 2016.



2016 Responses By Day-Of-Week



Average Daily Staffing:

The Sandusky Fire Department maintained a regularly scheduled average daily staffing level of 10 firefighters in 2016. Any drop in a staffing level below 11 firefighters per day is supplemented with voluntary overtime call-in by off-duty personnel.

Mutual Aid:

Over the 2016 calendar year, the Sandusky Fire Department provided mutual-aid 34 times and received mutual-aid 31 time in from other agencies within Erie County.
