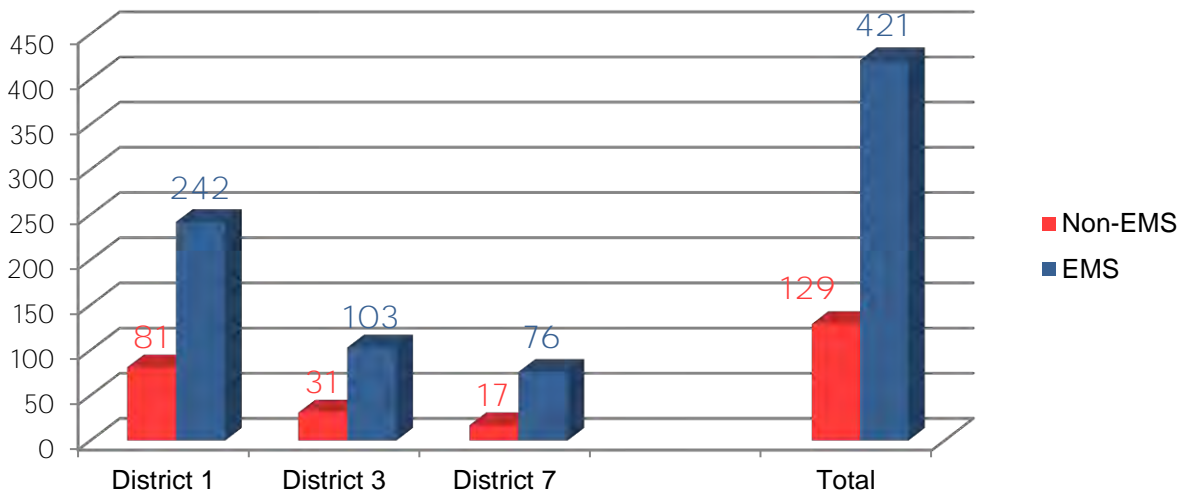

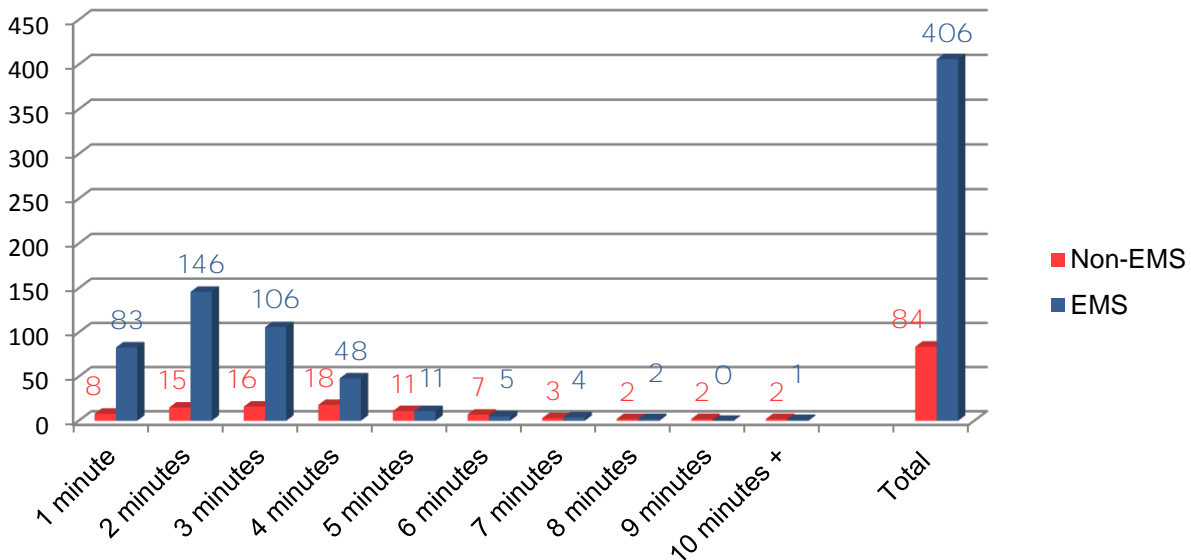


Operational Reports Generated For The Month



There were 550 reports generated in January. 59% of all reports were for District 1. Reports for District 3 and District 7 were 24% and 17% respectively.

District Emergency & Non-Emergency Response-To-Scene Statistics

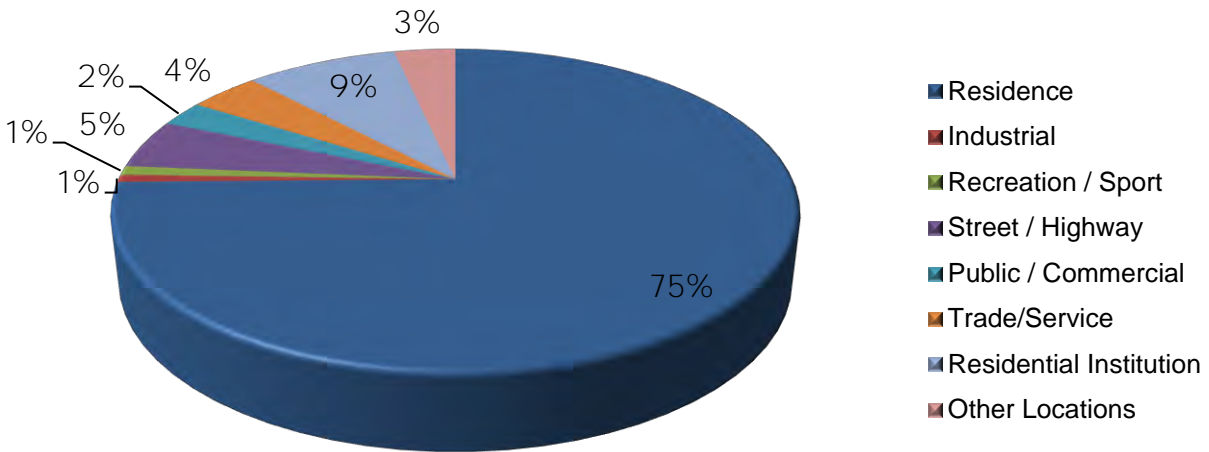


The average response-to-scene time for fire related calls was 4 minutes and 42 seconds. The average response time for EMS related calls was 2 minutes and 56 seconds.

The Sandusky Fire Department responded to 68% of fire related calls within 4 minutes and 94% of EMS related calls within 4 minutes. This averages out to 90% of all fire/ems related calls within 4 minutes.

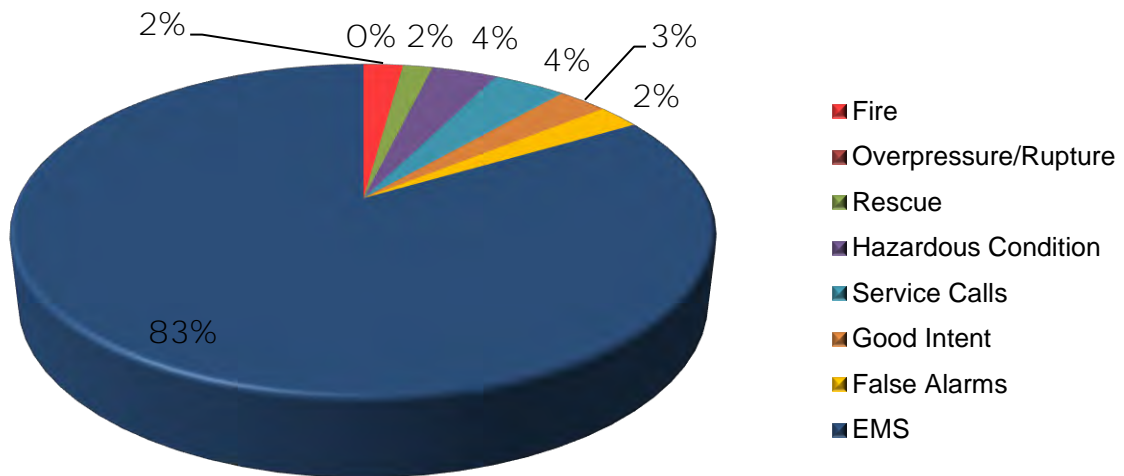


Response By Location



In January, 77% of all department responses were to residential occupancies (residences, nursing homes and residential institutions).

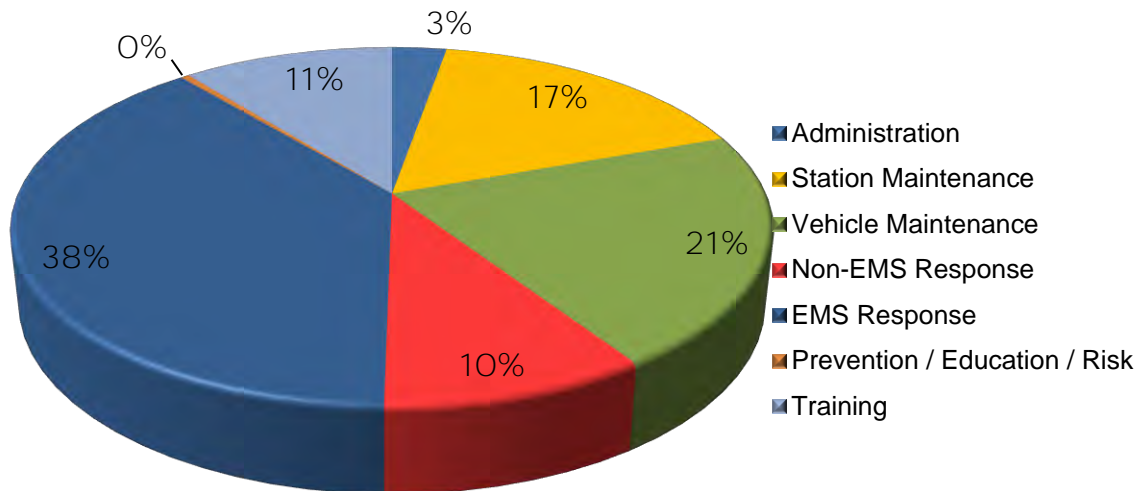
Incident Type



EMS related calls continue to be the highest requested service at 83%. There were 3 structure fires reported in January. False alarms represented 2% of all emergent activity. There was an estimated \$37,310 in fire loss in the month December.

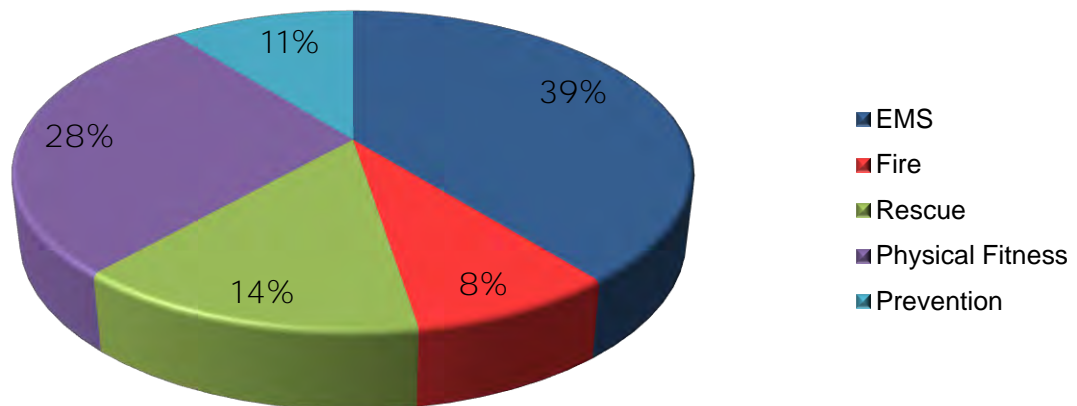


Monthly Staff Activity



51% of all January activity included fire/ems related calls. Station/Vehicle maintenance was 41% and training accounted for 10% of all staff activity.

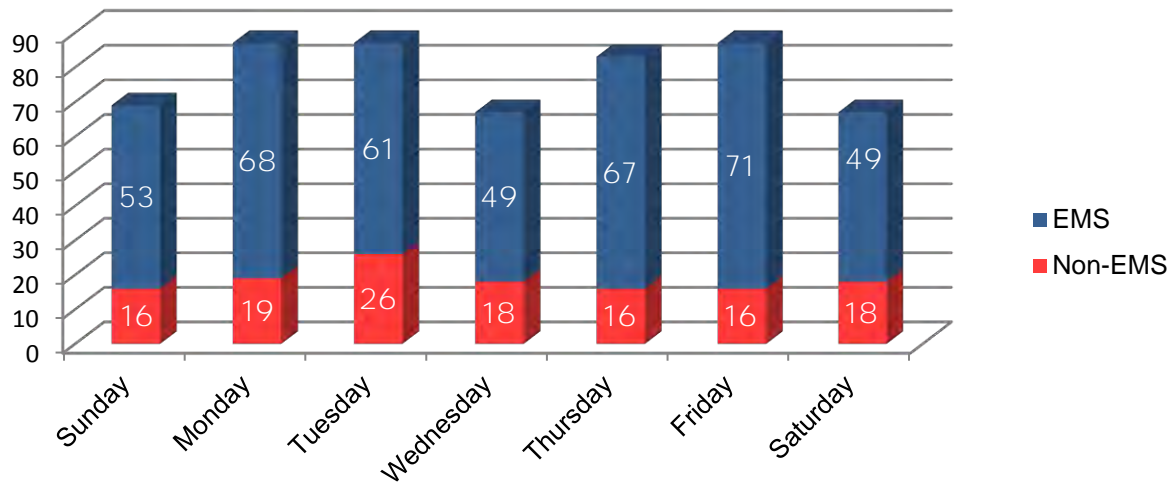
Training Analysis



Fire & EMS training comprised 47%. Physical fitness training comprised 28% of the total training hours.



Responses By Day-Of-Week



Average Daily Staffing:

The Sandusky Fire Department maintained a regularly scheduled average daily staffing level of 11 firefighters in January. Any drop in a staffing level below 11 firefighters per day is supplemented with voluntary overtime call-in by off-duty personnel.

Mutual Aid:

The Sandusky Fire Department provided mutual-aid 5 times and received mutual-aid 3 times in the month of January from other agencies within Erie County.
